6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 23-1-109(a) and by creating new
- 9 subsections (g) and (h) is amended to read:

23-1-109. State management of gray wolves.

- 13 (a) Subject to subsections (b) and (c) of this
- 14 section, this section The provisions of W.S. 11-6-302,
- 15 23-1-101, 23-1-302, 23-1-304 and 23-3-115 insofar as they

relate to gray wolves shall become effective: after the 1 2 date 3 4 (i) April 1, 2009, provided that gray wolves are 5 have been removed from the list of experimental nonessential population, endangered species or threatened 6 7 species in Wyoming; , and Wyoming has legal right to exercise full and continuous management authority over gray 8 wolves in the entire state of Wyoming subject only to 9 10 federal preemption. or 11 12 (ii) Not later than May 1, 2009. 13 14 (g) Upon the occurrence of either of the events in subsection (a) of this section, the commission shall assume 15 full management authority over gray wolves in those areas 16 17 of the state where gray wolves have been designated a trophy game animal pursuant to W.S. 23-1-304. 18 19 20 (h) The attorney general shall take all actions 21 necessary to defend the authority of the state to manage 22 wolves under this section. 23 **Section 2.** W.S. 23-1-109(b) through (f) is repealed. 24

4	(a) The legislature finds:
5	
6	(i) That gray wolves were introduced in
7	Yellowstone National Park in 1994 as a nonessential
8	experimental population;
9	
10	(ii) That under the terms of the final rule
11	implementing the reintroduction, wolves located outside of
12	a national park or national wildlife refuge were to be
13	treated under the Endangered Species Act as if they were
14	only proposed for listing and not listed;
15	
16	(iii) That the goal of the final rule
17	implementing the reintroduction was to reestablish a viable

16 (iii) That the goal of the final rule
17 implementing the reintroduction was to reestablish a viable
18 wolf population in the Yellowstone area, one (1) of three
19 (3) wolf recovery areas identified in the Northern Rocky
20 Mountain Wolf Recovery Plan;

22 (iv) That the final rule provided that it would 23 remain in effect until wolf recovery occurs or a scientific

1 review indicates that modifications in the experimental

2 status are necessary to achieve wolf recovery;

3

4 (v) That a viable wolf population has been

5 established in the Yellowstone area and therefore the final

6 rule is no longer in effect;

7

8 (vi) That because gray wolf populations outside

9 the national parks and wildlife refuge are not deemed to be

10 listed under the Endangered Species Act, delisting is not

11 an essential precondition to the state assuming management

12 authority of wolves in this state.

13

14 **Section 4.** This act is effective immediately upon

15 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

16 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

17 Constitution.
