A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the administration of government;
2 providing for a pilot study of a four day work week for
3 state employees as specified; providing for a report; and
4 providing for an effective date.

6 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

8 **Section 1.** Upon the direction of the governor, and
9 notwithstanding W.S. 27-5-101(a), the department of
10 administration and information shall conduct a pilot
11 project during selected months of 2009 and 2010 in which
12 state employees in a selected office area or areas shall
13 work four(4) ten (10) hour days per week rather than five
14 (5) eight (8) hour days per week. The director of the
15 department shall report on the results of the pilot project
16 to the governor and the legislature by November 1, 2010.

1 The report shall include findings on the energy savings
2 which resulted from the pilot project as well as estimates
3 of the energy savings which would result from statewide
4 implementation of a state employee four (4) day ten (10)
5 hours per day work week. The report shall include the
6 director's findings on the extent to which a state employee
7 four (4) day ten (10) hours per day work week could
8 reasonably be adopted statewide as well as findings on the
9 effects of that work schedule on state employee morale and
10 work efficiency.

12 **Section 2.** This act is effective July 1, 2009.
