- 11 **Section 1.** W.S. 31-5-1201 by creating a new
- 12 subsection (h) and 31-7-120(a)(iv) are amended to read:

- 14 31-5-1201. Violation of provisions to constitute
- 15 misdemeanor; penalties.

2	(h) The driver of any vehicle involved in an accident
3	resulting in the death or serious bodily injury, as defined
4	by W.S. 31-5-233(h), of another person shall, if issued a
5	citation for a moving violation under this act, be required
6	to appear personally in court for the disposition of the
7	citation. If the driver is convicted of the moving
8	violation, except a conviction under W.S. 31-5-233(h), and
9	the death or serious bodily injury was the direct result of
10	the conduct constituting the moving violation, the driver
11	shall be subject to the following penalties in addition to
12	any other penalties prescribed by law:
13	
14	(i) For a first conviction be punished by a fine
15	of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00), by
16	imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, or both;
17	
18	(ii) For a second or subsequent conviction
19	resulting in serious bodily injury within one (1) year
20	thereafter, be punished by a fine of not more than one
21	thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or by imprisonment for not
22	more than one (1) year, or both.

2 (a) The division shall maintain a readily available file of and suitable indexes for: 3

5 (iv) All accident reports and abstracts of court records of convictions received under the laws of this 6 state with suitable notations for each licensee showing the 7 convictions of the licensee and the traffic accidents in 8 which he has been involved. Any conviction for violation of 9 W.S. 31-5-1201(h) shall be notated on the licensee's record 10 11 for a period of ten (10) years following the conviction.
