for

1 AN ACT relating to the administration of government;
2 creating the Wyoming Industry Partnership Act; providing
3 definitions; establishing industry partnerships; providing
4 for a grant process; establishing the industry partnership
5 account; providing for rulemaking; requiring reports; and
6 providing for an effective date.

WYOMING INDUSTRY PARTNERSHIP ACT

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16 **9-2-2901. Short title.**

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2 This article shall be known as the "Wyoming Industry
3 Partnership Act of 2009".

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5 **9-2-2902. Definitions.**

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7 (a) As used in this article:

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9 (i) "Council" means the Wyoming workforce
10 development council;

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12 (ii) "Department" means the Wyoming department
13 of workforce services;

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15 (iii) "Industry identified solution" means the
16 development, recruitment or retention project that develops
17 or enhances the skills of Wyoming's workforce and supports
18 an industry in meeting its workforce needs;

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20 (iv) "Industry partnership" means an industry
21 directed collaboration, supported by economic development,
22 education and workforce systems to address common workforce
23 needs;

1 (v) "Industry sector" means a group of employers
2 closely linked by common products or services, workforce
3 needs, similar technologies, supply chains or other
4 economic links;

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6 (vi) "Targeted industry sector" means an
7 industry sector identified by the department as having
8 statewide or regional economic impact, immediate workforce
9 development needs and emerging or competitive career
10 opportunities.

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12 **9-2-2903. Industry sectors; identification.**

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14 (a) Industry sectors identified by the department in
15 conjunction with the council, shall be based on at a
16 minimum, the following:

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18 (i) Economic growth potential;

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20 (ii) Competitiveness;

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22 (iii) Employment base;

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24 (iv) Wages, benefits and career opportunities;

2 (v) Workforce development needs;

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4 (vi) Importance of the industry sector to the
5 state and regional economy.

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7 (b) The department shall periodically evaluate the
8 industry sectors and determine the need for any
9 modifications to the targeted industry sectors.

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11 **9-2-2904. Industry partnership account; grants;**
12 **rulemaking.**

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14 (a) The industry partnership account is created in
15 the department to support industry partnerships to identify
16 or implement industry identified solutions.

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18 (b) A competitive grant program shall be established
19 by the department that provides support to industry
20 partnerships to identify or implement industry identified
21 solutions.

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1 (c) The department shall promulgate rules and
2 regulations as may be necessary to implement the provisions
3 of this section.

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5 (d) The department shall require, at a minimum, a
6 private sector in-kind or cash matching fund of at least
7 fifty percent (50%) of a grant awarded under this article.

8
9 (e) A grant may be awarded to an approved industry
10 partnership to identify or implement industry identified
11 solutions, subject to available funds. Any proposal for a
12 grant shall be filed with the department on or before July
13 31 of each calendar year. A grant shall not be awarded for
14 the purchase, lease or repair of equipment or capital
15 construction, but may include textbooks or manuals. A
16 grant awarded to an industry partnership shall be for a
17 period not to exceed two (2) years and shall not exceed one
18 million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for the first year and
19 shall not exceed eight hundred seventy-five thousand
20 dollars (\$875,000.00) for the second year. Thereafter, no
21 state assistance shall be provided to the industry
22 partnership funded under this section.

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24 **9-2-2905. Report.**

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2 By September 1, 2010, the department shall report to the
3 joint minerals, business and economic development interim
4 committee on the funds awarded under this article. The
5 report shall include partnerships funded, the impact of the
6 partnerships, any industry identified solutions, the impact
7 of the industry identified solutions on current, projected
8 and emerging shortages in the Wyoming economy, industry,
9 employer and employee participation in workforce programs,
10 systemic changes that benefited industries, employers and
11 employees, partners' ability to streamline efforts and
12 resources and the results of the expenditures appropriated.

13

14 **Section 2.** This act is effective immediately upon
15 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law
16 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
17 Constitution.
