- 7 WHEREAS, current federal immigration laws fail to address
- 8 labor shortages and marketplace dynamics in the United
- 9 States; and

- 12 regarding foreign seasonal employees and guest workers
- 13 promotes unlawful immigration into the United States and
- 14 negatively impacts the state's economy; and

- 1 WHEREAS, inadequately addressing illegal immigration
- exhausts the State of Wyoming's limited resources including 2
- 3 social services, health care and law enforcement and
- results in economic hardship for the state and its citizens 4
- 5 and legal residents; and

- WHEREAS, development of comprehensive immigration policy 7
- and law designed to preserve and protect the nation's 8
- 9 borders and resources is necessary to safeguard its
- 10 citizens and legal residents; and

- WHEREAS, allowing foreign and guest workers reasonable 12
- 13 access to our country's borders serves the needs of Wyoming
- industry by providing a timely, stable and legal supply of 14
- workers where no United States citizen or legal resident 15
- workers are available; and 16

- WHEREAS, Congress is urged to include the Foreign Worker 18
- Visa system as part of any immigration reform; and 19

- WHEREAS, solving the problem of the existence of millions 21
- 22 of undocumented persons present in the United States is

complex and requires immediate attention; and 23

- 1 WHEREAS, development of a national program that efficiently
- screens and processes applicants for guest worker status is 2
- 3 crucial to the health and economic vitality of Wyoming
- 4 businesses and industry; and

- WHEREAS, it is necessary to develop a guest worker program 6
- and immigration policy that facilitates individuals seeking 7
- legal entry into the United States for 8 work and
- 9 reestablishing family relationships; and

- 11 WHEREAS, eliminating current visa backlogs and preventing
- future backlogs in order to meet workforce demands is 12
- 13 crucial to the health of the nation's business
- industry; and 14

- WHEREAS, streamlining the processing of H-2A 16
- 17 applications will enable agricultural employers to hire
- foreign workers needed for seasonal jobs and will benefit 18
- 19 the state's economy.

Section 1. That President Barack Obama and 1 the 2 members of the United States Congress take swift action to 3 enhance and enforce federal immigration policy and law and provide a comprehensive solution to the problem of illegal 4 5 immigration existing in the State of Wyoming and the

That Congress is urged to significantly 8 9 increase the number of immigrant visas issued annually, increase the current limits on H-1B and H-2B visas, 10 particularly in the industries requiring highly trained and 11 educated workers and seasonal hospitality operations, to 12 alleviate the difficulty of hiring guest or seasonal 13 workers. 14

That Congress is urged to expedite work 16 authorization documents for foreign nationals who obtain 17 university degrees from United States institutions ensure that individuals educated in the United States are 19 provided with an opportunity to give back to the nation 20 21 that has invested in the individual.
