Child health insurance program.

A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to the child health insurance program;
- 2 increasing the maximum family income level for eligibility
- 3 in the program; authorizing state funding for coverage as
- 4 specified; authorizing families or guardians with higher
- 5 incomes to buy program coverage for their children;
- 6 providing appropriations; authorizing a position; and
- 7 providing for an effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 11 **Section 1.** W.S. 35-25-101 and 35-25-103 are amended
- 12 to read:

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14 35-25-101. Uninsured child health insurance program.

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There is created a child health insurance program for 1

eliqible children and families with a gross monthly income 2

3 at or below one hundred eighty-five percent (185%) of the

federal poverty level, until July 1, 2005, and thereafter, 4

5 for families with a gross monthly income at or below two

hundred percent (200%) of the federal poverty level as 6

7 provided in W.S. 35-25-103 and 35-25-111.

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35-25-103. Child 9 health insurance program

10 eligibility.

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(a) Subject to approval of the state plan by the 12 United States secretary of health and human services, and 13 subject to available state and federal funding the 14 department shall provide a health insurance plan offered 15 through a private insurance company licensed by the 16 17 insurance commissioner to write insurance in Wyoming for an eliqible child whose monthly gross family income is not 18 more than one hundred eighty-five percent (185%) of the 19 20 federal poverty level, until July 1, 2005, and thereafter, 21 whose monthly gross family income is not more than two 22 hundred percent (200%) three hundred percent (300%) of the

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federal poverty level.

1	(b) The department shall charge a co-payment for								
2	services, as specified by the department, for program								
3	participants with incomes greater than two hundred percent								
4	(200%) and not more than three hundred percent (300%) of								
5	the federal poverty level.								
6									
7	(c) The department shall asses a fee to assist with								
8	the costs of the monthly premiums as follows:								
9									
10	(i) Not less than forty dollars (\$40.00) per								
11	child for program participants with income levels greater								
12	than two hundred percent (200%) and not more than two								
13	hundred fifty percent (250%) of the federal poverty level;								
14									
15	(ii) Not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) per								
16	child for program participants with income levels greater								
17	than two hundred fifty percent (250%) and not more than								
18	three hundred percent (300%) of the federal poverty level;								
19									
20	(iii) No more than two (2) children shall be								
21	assessed per participating family.								
22									
23	(d) The family of an otherwise eligible child whose								
24	family income is greater than three hundred percent (300%)								

1	of	the	federal	poverty	level	may	purchase	coverage	for	the

- child under the program developed pursuant to W.S. 2
- 3 35-25-104, subject to the following conditions:

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- 5 (i) The family shall pay the full premium cost
- of the coverage, as determined by the health benefits plan 6
- 7 committee;

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- 9 (ii) The child has not been covered under
- another individual or group health insurance plan for a 10
- 11 continuous period of four (4) months prior to applying for
- coverage under this subsection. 12

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- (e) The department may vary the package of benefits 14
- available to participants depending upon their income 15
- 16 level.

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- (f) A child who is determined eligible to receive 18
- benefits under this section shall remain eligible for 19
- 20 twelve (12) months as long as the child resides in the
- 21 state of Wyoming and has not yet attained nineteen (19)
- 22 years of age. A child's eligibility to receive benefits
- under this act shall be redetermined on an annual basis. A 23
- simplified application process, which includes 24

1 eligibility requirements, shall be provided throughout the state at various public and private establishments approved 2 by the department of health. To be determined eligible to 3 4 receive benefits under this section, a child shall not be 5 eligible under the Wyoming Medical Assistance and Services Act, except as provided in paragraph (d)(ii) of this 6 section shall not have been covered under another health 7 insurance plan for a minimum of one (1) month prior to 8 9 application for coverage under this act or, upon birth, the 10 child would not otherwise be covered by a public or private 11 health insurance plan. Eligibility under this section shall be determined by the department of health or its designee. 12

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14 (q) In addition to the waiting period in subsection (f) of this section, a child whose family income is more 15 than two hundred fifty percent (250%) and less than or 16 17 equal to three hundred percent (300%) of the federal poverty level shall not be eliqible for this program if the 18 19 child is eligible for coverage under a group health insurance plan offered by an employer of the child's family 20 21 member.

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1 (a) There is appropriated seventy-five thousand 2 seventy-five dollars (\$75,075.00) from the general fund and 3 one hundred forty-nine thousand four hundred twenty-five 4 dollars (\$149,425.00) from federal funds to the department 5 of health. This appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the effective date of this act and ending 6 June 30, 2010. This appropriation shall only be expended 7 for the purpose of providing health insurance to children 8 9 whose monthly gross family income is greater than two hundred percent (200%) but not more than three hundred 10 11 percent (300%) of the federal poverty level. Notwithstanding any other provision 12 of law, this 13 appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated state funds 14 remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided 15 by law on June 30, 2010. 16

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is appropriated nineteen thousand two 18 (b) There hundred eighty dollars (\$19,280.00) from the general fund 19 20 thirty-five thousand eight hundred seven dollars 21 (\$35,807.00) in federal funds to fund one (1) full-time 22 position in the department of health. This appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the effective date 23 of this act and ending June 30, 2010. 24 This appropriation

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shall only be expended for the purpose of administering the 1

2 child health insurance program. Notwithstanding any other

provision of law, this appropriation shall not be 3

4 transferred or expended for any other purpose and any

5 unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this

appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30, 6

2010. 7

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Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2009. 9
