A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to instream flows; providing for
- 2 acquisition of temporary instream flows; and providing for
- 3 an effective date.

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5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 7 **Section 1.** W.S. 41-3-110 by creating a new subsection
- 8 (b), by amending and renumbering (b) as (c) and by
- 9 renumbering (c) and (d) as (d) and (e), 41-3-1002(c) and
- $10 \quad 41-3-1007$ are amended to read:

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- 12 41-3-110. Right to acquire temporary water rights for
- 13 highway or railroad roadbed construction or repair; right
- 14 to acquire temporary water rights for instream flows;

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15 application; restrictions; fee.

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1 (b) The state shall have the right to acquire by 2 purchase, gift or lease the right to the use of water which 3 may be embraced in any adjudicated or valid unadjudicated 4 water right, or any portion thereof, for a period of not to 5 exceed two (2) years, for instream flow purposes, on its own behalf, provided: 6 7 (i) Only the state shall have the authority to 8 9 acquire the water pursuant to W.S. 41-3-1007(a)(ii); and 10 11 (ii) Any temporary transfer shall be allowed 12 only if no other appropriator is injured thereby. 13 14 Before any right to such use pursuant to (b)(c) 15 subsection (a) or (b) of this section shall become 16 operative, an application must be made in writing on a form 17 provided or designated by the state engineer, with a copy of any conveyance or agreement provided, and it shall be 18 filed in the office of 19 the state engineer for his 20 ratification and approval. Upon approval by the state 21 engineer, an order authorizing such use and designating the 22 method, place, and period of use may be entered. No loss, abandonment or impairment of such water rights shall occur 23

or attach as a result of such change or use, except as

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1 provided by said conveyance or agreement and order of the

2 state engineer, and upon termination of the temporary

3 diversion and use, as stated in the order, any affected

4 right to the use of water shall automatically be reinvested

5 with all the rights, privileges and uses, and purposes

6 theretofore held and enjoyed.

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8 (c) (d) Only that portion of a water right so acquired 9 which has been consumptively used under the historical use 10 made of the water right, may be diverted by a temporary 11 user. In determining the consumptive use of water rights 12 for the direct use of the natural unstored flow of any 13 stream for irrigation purposes, the return flow from those 14 rights shall be presumed to be fifty percent (50%). In 15 those situations where an assumption of fifty percent (50%) return flow would be significantly in error, the state 16 17 engineer shall have the prerogative of making determination of the actual amount of return flow, and the 18 amount of water which can be diverted for the temporary use 19 20 provided herein shall be adjusted accordingly. The actual 21 historic return flow, or the assumed return flow of fifty 22 percent (50%) will be left in the stream for the use of foregoing 23 downstream appropriators. The formula and 24 procedure for the determination of consumptive use

1 return flow shall be limited to this section and shall have

2 no application to any other statute of the state of

3 Wyoming. Nothing herein contained shall be treated or

4 construed as changing the prior use of water held by said

5 owner or owners and as provided by the laws of the state of

6 Wyoming.

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8 $\frac{\text{(d)}(e)}{\text{(e)}}$ The state engineer shall assess a fee not to

9 exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for his review and

10 approval of temporary water agreements. This fee shall

11 accompany the agreement application and shall be retained

12 and credited to the general fund whether the agreement or

13 request is approved or denied.

Acquisition existing οf rights for 7 instream flow purposes. 8 9 The state of Wyoming may: (a) 10 11 (i) Permanently acquire any existing water 12 rights in streams of Wyoming by transfer or gift for the 13 purpose of providing instream flows, provided that a change 14 in use of the right acquired shall be in accordance with 15 W.S. 41-3-104;16 17 (ii) Temporarily acquire any existing water rights in streams of Wyoming by purchase, gift or lease for 18 19 the purpose of providing instream flows, provided that a 20 change in use of the right acquired shall be in accordance 21 with W.S. 41-3-110. 22 (b) Any right acquired and changed shall be in the 23 name of the state of Wyoming and shall be administered by 24

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the state engineer and the board of control, who shall 1

- 2 insure that the use of water for instream flows shall not
- 3 interfere with existing water rights or impair the value of
- such rights or related property. The game and fish 4
- 5 commission shall act as a petitioner in a petition for
- 6 change in use under this section.

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- (b)(c) Any such water rights acquired and changed 8
- 9 shall be limited to a specified stream segment by the board
- 10 of control with priority date intact.

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12 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2009.
