16 ARTICLE 1

1	CAREER AND TECHNICAL TRAINING GRANTS
2	
3	27-15-101. Definitions.
4	
5	(a) As used in this article:
6	
7	(i) "Approved career and technical training
8	provider" means:
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10	(A) Wyoming community colleges, the
11	University of Wyoming, boards of cooperative educational
12	services, private post secondary educational institutions
13	and private schools or organizations providing career and
14	technical training in Wyoming which are licensed or
15	registered under W.S. 21-2-401 through 21-2-407;
16	
17	(B) Training facilities and entities
18	approved by and registered with the office of
19	apprenticeship, United States department of labor.
20	
21	(ii) "Career and technical training" means
22	training through an approved training career and technical
23	training provider that develops or enhances the skills of
24	an individual for specific careers that are based on the

1	workforce needs of the state as identified by the
2	department;
3	
4	(iii) "Career readiness score" means qualifying
5	scores on a multilevel career readiness pre-instructional
6	assessment tool, pre-approved by the department, to qualify
7	an individual's level of proficiency in the following
8	measurable work-ready skills:
9	
10	(A) Reading for information;
11	
12	(B) Applied mathematics;
13	
14	(C) Locating information;
15	
16	(D) Any additional skills necessary to meet
17	business and industry skill demand.
18	
19	(iv) "Department" means the department of
20	workforce services.
21	
22	27-15-102. Career and technical training grants
23	established.

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24

(a) The department shall, by rule and regulation, 1

establish and administer a program to provide training 2

3 grants for the training of persons participating in a

4 career and technical training program.

5

The purpose of the career and technical training 6

grant program is to provide career and technical training 7

grants to develop or enhance the skills of Wyoming's 8

9 workforce based on current, projected or emerging labor

10 shortages in the Wyoming economy.

11

(c) The department is authorized to promulgate rules 12

13 and regulations for the purpose of implementing this

article. All rules and regulations shall be promulgated in 14

consultation with training providers and employers. 15

grants shall be awarded under this article until adoption 16

17 of final rules pursuant to this subsection.

13 27-15-103. Career and technical training grants;

14 eligibility.

15

16 (a) Under the career and technical training grant

17 program, subject to availability of funds as determined by

18 the legislature, the state shall provide a grant pursuant

19 to this article to any trainee who has been accepted by and

20 enrolls in an approved training program, and who meets the

21 following qualifications:

22

1 (i) The trainee has demonstrated twelve (12)

2 months Wyoming residence as defined in W.S.

 $3 \quad 22-1-102(a)(xxx);$

4

5 (ii) The trainee has:

6

7 (A) Graduated from high school or has

8 obtained a general equivalency diploma in accordance with

9 rules adopted by the department of education pursuant to

10 W.S. 21-16-1308(b)(iv); and

11

12 (B) Has earned the baseline career

13 readiness score as preapproved by the department under this

14 article for the type of training to be undertaken.

15 However, the department may provide by rule and regulation

16 for an application and approval process using alternative

17 criteria that are the functional equivalent of the career

18 readiness score.

19

20 (b) No trainee shall be eligible for a grant under

21 this article for more than the equivalent of two (2) years.

22 No trainee shall be eligible for a grant under this article

23 for any period commencing after four (4) calendar years

24 following the trainee's initial eligibility. For purposes

- 1 of this subsection a trainee's initial eligibility shall be
- 2 deemed to commence on the program start date identified on
- 3 the application or the date the program actually begins,
- 4 whichever is earlier. The department shall by rule and
- 5 regulation establish exceptions to this subsection for
- 6 military service, religious service and other good cause
- 7 shown.

8

- 9 (c) A trainee is not eligible for a grant under this
- 10 article if he:

11

- 12 (i) Is not a United States citizen or a
- 13 permanent resident alien who meets the definition of an
- 14 eligible noncitizen under federal Title IV requirements or
- 15 requirements of a subsequent similar federal enactment;

16

- 17 (ii) Has not complied with United States
- 18 selective service system requirements for registration, if
- 19 the requirements are applicable to the trainee;

20

- 21 (iii) Is in default on a federal Title IV
- 22 education loan. Nothing in this paragraph prohibits a
- 23 trainee who is otherwise eligible for a grant under this
- 24 article and has fully repaid a defaulted loan or is no

1 longer in default, from receiving a grant after the default

2 is cured;

3

4 (iv) Owes a refund under a federal Title IV

5 trainee financial aid program or a subsequently enacted

6 similar federal student financial aid program, or a student

7 financial aid program administered through the state.

8 Nothing in this paragraph prohibits a trainee who is

9 otherwise eligible for a grant under this article and has

10 fully paid the refund owed, from receiving a grant after

11 paying the refund owed;

12

13 (v) Is incarcerated;

14

15 (vi) Is not eligible to hold a license or is

16 otherwise disqualified to be employed in the occupation for

17 which the training is sought;

18

19 (vii) Has been the recipient of more than two

20 (2) semesters of the Hathaway scholarship during the five

21 (5) year period before the date of application; or

22

23 (viii) Does not otherwise qualify under this

24 article for a grant.

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(d) An eligible trainee under the age of twentyone (21) may receive up to the equivalent of fifty percent
(50%) of the Hathaway performance scholarship award
pursuant to W.S. 21-16-1304. An eligible trainee age
twenty-one (21) or older may receive up to the equivalent
of one hundred percent (100%) of the Hathaway performance
scholarship.

10 (e) The department shall pay the cost of an eligible
11 applicant's initial career readiness tests. Any retesting
12 to improve an applicant's score shall be at the applicant's
13 expense.

27-15-104. Career and technical training grants;

16 agreement; remedies upon breach; technical assistance.

17

18 (a) Grant payments shall be made directly to an
19 approved career and technical training provider. Grantees
20 shall enter into a contract with the department providing
21 that the trainee shall work in Wyoming in the trade for
22 which the trainee receives training for the period provided
23 in the department's rules. Commitment duration shall be
24 based on the value of the training opportunity, shall be

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1 commensurate with the magnitude of the grant and shall not

2 be less than the length of the grantee's training program

3 or two (2) years, whichever is less. For purposes of this

4 subsection, "work in Wyoming" means that the grantee is

5 employed for at least eighty percent (80%) of the grantee's

6 paid work hours in the trade for which the grant was

7 awarded.

8

9 (b) If a trainee breaches the agreement required by

10 subsection (a) of this section, the trainee shall repay

11 that portion of all funds for the corresponding contract

12 period provided on behalf of the trainee under the

13 agreement, together with costs of collection and attorney

14 fees. The department shall by rule and regulation

15 establish exceptions to this subsection for military

16 service, religious service and other good cause shown.

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18 (c) The department shall provide technical assistance

19 to prospective trainees in the application and reporting

20 requirements established by department rules.

1 The department shall report by June 1, 2010 to the joint

2 education interim committee, the joint labor, health and

3 social services interim committee and the joint

4 appropriations interim committee on the career and

5 technical training grant program, including industry and

6 trainee participation, numbers of persons completing

7 training, numbers of former trainees working in Wyoming,

8 total grant expenditures, per trainee grant expenditures

9 and administrative expenditures.

11 Section 2.

12

13 (a) There is appropriated one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) from the general fund to the department of 14 workforce services. This appropriation shall be for the 15 period beginning with the effective date of this act and 16 17 ending June 30, 2010. This appropriation shall only be expended for the purpose of the career and technical 18 training grants established under W.S. 27-15-102 created by 19 20 this act. Upon the award of a career and technical training 21 grant, the department shall set aside and encumber the full 22 amount and cost of any grant awarded for the entire period of the grant. The department shall establish by rule and 23 regulation when an awarded grant shall terminate. 24 Upon

1 termination of a grant, any unexpended portion of the grant

2 shall be available to fund additional grants as provided

3 under W.S. 27-15-102 created by this act. Notwithstanding

4 any other provision of law, this appropriation shall not be

5 transferred or expended for any other purpose and any

6 unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this

7 appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30,

8 2010. Any obligated funds shall revert after June 30, 2010

9 upon the termination of the grant which encumbered those

10 funds.

This appropriation shall 14 be for the period beginning with the effective date of this 15 act and ending June 30, 2010. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any 22
