1 2 (a) For purposes of this article: 3 (i) "Alcoholic beverage establishment" means a 4 5 facility holding a license or permit issued pursuant to article 2 or 3 of chapter 4 of title 12; 6 7 (ii) "Department" means the department of 8 9 health; 10 (iii) "Enclosed public place" means an indoor 11 12 area, room or vehicle that the general public is allowed to 13 enter or that serves as a place of work, including but not limited to: 14 15 16 (A) Restaurants; 17 18 (B) Stores; 19 20 (C) Public and private office buildings and 21 offices, including all office buildings and offices of 22 political subdivisions and state government; 23

1 (D) Trains, buses and other forms of public 2 transportation; 3 4 Health care facilities; (E) 5 6 (F) Auditoriums, arenas and assembly 7 facilities; 8 (G) Meeting rooms open to the public; 9 10 11 Alcoholic beverage establishments; (H) 12 13 (J) Facilities of the University of 14 Wyoming, community colleges and private colleges; 15 16 (K) Public and private school facilities. 17 18 (iv) "Establishment" means an enterprise under one (1) roof that serves the public and for which a single 19 20 person, agency, corporation or legal entity is responsible; 21 22 (v) "Place of work" means an enclosed room where one (1) or more individuals work; 23 24

1 (vi) "Smoking" or "to smoke" includes the acts 2 of lighting, smoking or carrying a lighted cigar, 3 cigarette, pipe or any other product intended to provide 4 smoke for inhalation. 5 6 35-4-902. Smoking in enclosed public places 7 prohibited; notice; exceptions. 8 9 Except as otherwise provided in this section, (a) 10 smoking in an enclosed public place is prohibited. 11 12 (b) The proprietor or manager of an establishment 13 containing enclosed public places shall post a sign in a 14 conspicuous place at all public entrances to the establishment indicating, in a manner that can be easily 15 read and understood, that smoking in the enclosed public 16 17 place is prohibited. 18 19 (c) The proprietor or manager of an intrastate bus 20 that is not chartered shall prohibit smoking in all parts 21 of the bus. 22

1 (d) The prohibition in subsection (a) of this section 2 does not apply to the following places, whether or not the 3 public is allowed access to those places: 4 5 (i) Until January 1, 2010, alcoholic beverage establishments, provided that smoke from the establishment 6 does not infiltrate into other enclosed public places which 7 are not alcoholic beverage establishments; 8 9 10 (ii) A private residence, unless it is used for 11 either of the following purposes, in which case the prohibition in subsection (a) of this section applies: 12 13 14 (A) A child caring facility, as defined in W.S. 14 - 4 - 101(a);15 16 17 (B) A health care facility, as defined in W.S. 35-2-901(a). 18 19 20 (iii) A private motor vehicle; 21 22 (iv) A hotel or motel room designated as a 23 smoking room and rented to a guest; 24

1 (v) A site that is being used in connection with 2 the practice of cultural activities by American Indians that is in accordance with the federal American Indian 3 4 Religious Freedom Act, 42 U.S.C. 1996, 1996a. 5 6 35-4-903. Rules and regulations. 7 8 The department shall enforce W.S. 35-4-901 through 35-4-903 9 and shall promulgate rules and regulations necessary to 10 carry out this article. 11 12 35-4-904. Smoking in public; penalties. 13 14 (a) A person who violates W.S. 35-4-902(a) is guilty 15 of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) nor more than one hundred dollars 16 17 (\$100.00). 18 19 (b) A person who owns, manages, operates or otherwise 20 controls a public place where smoking is prohibited by W.S. 21 35-4-902 and who fails to comply with the provisions of 22 this article is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be 23 punished as follows:

1 (i) A fine of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for 2 the first violation; 3 4 (ii) A fine of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for 5 a second or subsequent violation. 6 35-4-905. Local regulation. 7 8 9 The provisions of this article shall not prohibit adoption 10 of ordinances or regulations by counties or municipalities 11 that are more strict than the provisions of this article as 12 to places in which smoking is prohibited or as to the 13 penalty or remedy imposed for violation of an ordinance or regulation prohibiting smoking in public places. 14 Local authorities shall have the express authority to enforce 15 16 local smoking prohibitions by action in their respective 17 local municipal courts. 18 19 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2009. 20 21 (END)
