- 1 AN ACT relating to government information; providing
- 2 definitions; creating the Wyoming public finance website;
- 3 requiring the creation and maintenance of the website;
- 4 providing rulemaking authority; establishing the select
- 5 committee on technology, reporting and analytics; requiring
- 6 a report; providing appropriations; and providing for an
- 7 effective date.

9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 11 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-2-1035 through 9-2-1037 and
- 12 28-11-501 are created to read:

14 **9-2-1035.** Definitions.

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16 (a) As used in this act:

2 (i) "Committee" means the select committee on

3 technology, reporting and analytics created under W.S.

4 28-11-501;

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6 (ii) "Department" means the department of

7 administration and information;

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9 (iii) "Internet" means the internet, World Wide

10 Web or a similar proprietary or common carrier electronic

11 system;

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13 (iv) "Participating state entity" means the

14 state of Wyoming including the executive, legislative and

15 judicial branches of government and any department,

16 division, agency, board, commission or other

17 instrumentality of those branches;

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19 (v) "Public financial information" means records

20 that are required to be made available on the Wyoming

21 public finance website as required by this act; and

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23 (vi) "This act" means W.S. 9-2-1035 through

24 9-2-1037.

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2 9-2-1036. Wyoming public finance website.

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4 (a) There is created the Wyoming public finance 5 website to be administered by the department.

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7 (b) The Wyoming public finance website shall:

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9 (i) Permit Wyoming taxpayers to view and track

10 the use of taxpayer dollars by making participating state

11 entities' public financial information available on the

12 internet;

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14 (ii) Allow a person who has internet access to

15 use the website without paying a fee;

16

17 (iii) Allow the public to search public

18 financial information on the Wyoming public finance website

19 using criteria established by the department in

20 consultation with the committee;

21

22 (iv) Provide access to financial reports,

23 financial audits, budgets or other financial documents that

24 are used to allocate, appropriate, spend and account for

government funds as may be established by rule under W.S. 1 2 9-2-1037;3 4 (v) Have a unique and simplified website 5 address; 6 7 (vi) Be directly accessible via a link from the main page of the official state website; and 8 9 (vii) Include other links, features or functions 10 11 that will assist the public in obtaining and reviewing 12 public financial information. 13 (c) The department shall be responsible for: 14 15

(i) Establishing and maintaining the website, 16

17 including the provision of equipment, resources

personnel as necessary; 18

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20 (ii) Maintaining an archive of all information

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21 posted to the website;

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1	(iii) Coordinating and processing the receipt
2	and posting of public financial information from
3	participating state entities.
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5	(d) The department may:
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7	(i) Consult with the committee on matters
8	related to the implementation and administration of this
9	act;
10	
11	(ii) Develop plans and make recommendations to
12	the committee related to the implementation of the
13	provisions of this act;
14	
15	(iii) Determine, in consultation with the
16	committee, what public financial information shall be
17	provided by participating state entities, provided that the
18	public financial information:
19	
20	(A) Only includes records that:
21	
22	(I) Are classified as public records
23	under W.S. 16-4-201 through 16-4-205;

1	(II) Are an accounting of monies,
2	funds, accounts, bonds, loans, expenditures or revenues,
3	regardless of source; and
4	
5	(III) Are owned, held or administered
6	by the participating state entity that is required to
7	provide the record.
8	
9	(B) Is of the type or nature that should be
10	accessible to the public via a website based on
11	considerations of:
12	
13	(I) The cost effectiveness of
14	providing the information;
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16	(II) The value of providing the
17	information to the public; and
18	
19	(III) Privacy and security
20	implications.
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22	(iv) Evaluate the cost effectiveness of
23	implementing specific information resources and features on
24	the website and report that information to the committee.

2 (e) A participating state entity shall permit the 3 public to view the public financial information of the 4 participating state entity via the website, beginning with

5 information that is generated on or after July 1, 2009.

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7 (f) Not later than January 1, 2010, the website shall

8 be operational and permit access to the public financial

9 information of participating state entities.

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11 9-2-1037. Rulemaking authority.

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13 (a) The department, after consultation with the 14 committee, shall adopt rules to:

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16 (i) Require participating state entities to

17 provide public financial information for inclusion on the

18 Wyoming public finance website;

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20 (ii) Define the term "public financial

21 information" as it applies to participating state entities

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22 in accordance with the provisions of this act; and

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1	(iii) Establish procedures for obtaining,
2	submitting, reporting, storing and providing public
3	financial information on the Wyoming public finance website
4	which may include a specified reporting frequency and form.
5	
6	(b) The department, after consultation with the
7	committee, may adopt rules to require a participating
8	entity to list certain expenditures made by a person under
9	a contract with the participating entity. If a list is
10	required under this subsection, the list shall include:
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12	(i) The name of the participating entity making
13	the expenditure;
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15	(ii) The name of the person receiving the
16	expenditure;
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18	(iii) The date of the expenditure;
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20	(iv) The amount of the expenditure;
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22	(v) The purpose of the expenditure;
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24	(vi) The name of each party to the contract;

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2	(vii) An electronic copy of the contract; and
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4	(viii) Any other criteria designated by rule of
5	the department.
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7	ARTICLE 5
8	SELECT COMMITTEE ON TECHNOLOGY, REPORTING AND ANALYTICS
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10	28-11-501. Appointment of members; powers and duties.
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12	(a) Not later than March 15 following each general
13	election, the president of the senate shall appoint six (6)
14	members of the senate, and the speaker of the house of
15	representatives shall appoint six (6) members of the house
16	to a select committee on technology, reporting and
17	analytics. Not more than four (4) members from each house
18	shall be from the same political party.
19	
20	(b) The select committee shall:
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22	(i) Select from among its members a chairman and
23	vice-chairman;

1 (ii) Monitor the establishment and 2 implementation of the technological infrastructure of the 3 state; 4 5 (iii) Monitor technological opportunities to eliminate redundancy, ensure efficiency and provide more 6 7 access to state government to citizens of the state; 8 9 (iv) Prepare and submit recommendations to the legislature, including sponsoring legislation, to improve 10 11 statutes related to technology, reporting and analysis; 12 13 (v) Develop knowledge and expertise among its 14 members regarding issues related to technology, reporting and analysis; and 15 16 17 (vi) Consult with the department of 18 administration and information as provided in W.S. 9-2-1036 19 and 9-2-1037. 20 21 (c) The state chief information officer shall provide 22 an annual report to the select committee on statewide technology issues, initiatives, projects and expenditures. 23 24

1 (d) The select committee may:

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3 (i) Secure consulting services, if necessary, to 4 provide technical assistance regarding state technology 5 policy; and

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7 (ii) Review budgets and expenditures related to 8 any aspect of state technology policy and implementation.

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10 2. Section There is appropriated twenty-eight 11 thousand dollars (\$28,000.00) from the general fund to the legislative service office. This appropriation shall be 12 13 for the period beginning with the effective date of this act and ending June 30, 2010. This appropriation shall 14 only be expended for the purpose of meetings of the select 15 committee on technology, reporting and analytics created 16 17 under section 1 of this act.

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Section 3. There is appropriated twelve thousand three hundred dollars (\$12,300.00) from the general fund to the department of administration and information. This appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the effective date of this act and ending June 30, 2010. This appropriation shall only be expended for the purposes of

1 carrying out the provisions of W.S. 9-2-1035 through

9-2-1037 as created in this act.

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4 Section 4. Not later than March 15, 2009 or ten (10)

5 days after the effective date of this act, whichever date

6 is later, the president of the senate and the speaker of

7 the house shall appoint members to the select committee on

8 technology, reporting and analytics as provided in W.S.

9 28-11-501(a).

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11 **Section 5.** This act is effective immediately upon

12 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

13 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

14 Constitution.
