A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the administration of government; transferring Serve Wyoming, a not-for-profit organization 2 3 originally known as the commission for national and 4 community service, from the department of workforce services to the office of the governor; repealing a prior 5 transfer of the organization; specifying membership of the 6 7 organization; specifying powers and duties; providing for 8 continuation of terms of appointments; providing an 9 appropriation; and providing for an effective date. 10 11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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13 Section 1. W.S. 9-1-223 is created to read:

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9-1-223. Serve Wyoming; composition; 1 powers and 2 duties; definitions. 3 4 (a) Serve Wyoming is transferred from the department 5 of workforce services to the office of the governor and shall operate as a private not-for-profit corporation, as 6 7 specified in this section. 8 9 (b) The membership of Serve Wyoming shall be as 10 provided in 42 U.S.C. 12638. 11 12 (c) In addition to voting members appointed under 13 subsection (b) of this section, there shall be at least one (1) ex officio nonvoting member of the corporation serving 14 on Serve Wyoming. Other nonvoting members may be appointed 15 16 as provided in 42 U.S.C. 12638. 17 Appointed members of Serve Wyoming shall serve 18 (d) terms of three (3) years and may be reappointed to serve 19 20 additional terms. Voting members of Serve Wyoming shall 21 elect a chairman and a vice chairman from among the voting 22 members. 23 24 (e) The purpose of Serve Wyoming shall be to:

1 2 (i) Receive federal, state and private funds or 3 donations; 4 5 (ii) Administer funds received under this 6 subsection to foster community services, volunteerism, 7 mentoring and literacy; 8 9 (iii) Develop and implement a comprehensive, statewide plan for promoting volunteer involvement and 10 11 citizen participation in Wyoming; 12 13 (iv) Communicate and cooperate with national and 14 state organizations that support the mission of Serve 15 Wyoming; 16 17 (v) Fulfill federal program administration requirements, including working with the corporation on 18 national and community service to assist in the provision 19 20 health care and childcare for of service program 21 participants; 22 23 Submit (vi) annual state applications for 24 federal funding for selected Americorps programs;

1 2 Monitor the performance and progress of (vii) 3 programs receiving funds from Serve Wyoming; 4 (viii) Provide technical assistance to 5 local not-for-profit organizations and other entities in planning 6 7 programs, applying for funds and in implementing and operating high quality programs; 8 9 10 (ix) Develop mechanisms for recruitment and 11 placement of people interested in participating in service 12 programs; 13 14 (x) Delegate nonpolicy making duties to a public not-for-profit organization, subject 15 private or to 16 requirements that the corporation on national and community 17 service may prescribe. 18 19 (f) As used in this section: 20 21 (i) "Corporation" means the corporation on 22 national and community service created by the National and Community Service Act of 1990; 23 24

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1 (ii) "Serve Wyoming" means the not-for-profit 2 corporation within the governor's office to implement the 3 purposes of the National and Community Service Act of 1990. 4

5 Section 2. 2002 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 100,
6 Section 1(a)(iii)(A) is repealed.

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Section 3. There is appropriated one hundred twenty-8 9 five thousand dollars (\$125,000.00) from the general fund 10 to the governor's office. This appropriation shall be for 11 the period beginning July 1, 2009 and ending June 30, 2010. This appropriation shall only be expended for the purpose 12 funding the administrative costs incurred by Serve 13 of 14 Wyoming. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any 15 16 any unexpended, unobligated funds other purpose and 17 remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30, 2010. 18

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20 Section 4. Any appointment to Serve Wyoming made 21 prior to July 1, 2009 shall continue for the period of the 22 appointment and may be renewed as provided by W.S. 23 9-1-223(d), created by section 1 of this act.
