Determination of eligibility for retirement; 11 board to determine equivalent of years of service; credit 12 13 for military service. 14 (c) Credit shall be allowed for any period of time 15 16 which a member spends in military or other emergency

2	adopted by the board pursuant to the Veterans' Reemployment
3	Rights Act (38 U.S.C. 4321, et seq. P.L. 93-508). Subject
4	to amounts made available by legislative appropriation and
5	\underline{I} n accordance with rule and regulation of the board, \underline{until}
6	June 30, 2018 up to two (2) years of credit allowed under
7	this subsection may be provided at no cost to the member.
8	After June 30, 2010, each state agency, department or
9	institution, including the University of Wyoming and the
10	community colleges shall estimate the amount required for
11	provision of credits under this subsection for the next
12	biennium and shall include the estimate in the agency's
13	biennial budget request. Provision for payment of
14	employer's contributions under this subsection shall be as
15	provided in W.S. 9-3-414.

Section 2. Two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000.00), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the general fund to the Wyoming retirement board for fiscal years 2009 and 2010 to fund military service retirement credits for retirement system members pursuant to W.S. 9-3-417(c).
