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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 9 **Section 1.** W.S. 11-6-302(a)(ix)(B)(II), (x)(B)(I) and
- 10 (II), 23-1-101(a) (viii) (B) (II), (xii) (B) (I) and (II),
- 11 23-1-302(a)(xxix), 23-1-304(a), (c), (d), (e) and by
- 12 creating a new subsection (q) and 23-3-115(c) are amended
- 13 to read:

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17 (a) As used in this article:

2	(ix) "Predatory animal" means:

4	(B) Until the date gray wolves are removed
5	from the list of experimental nonessential population,
6	endangered species or threatened species in Wyoming as
7	provided by W.S. 23-1-108, "predatory animal" includes
8	wolves. After that date, "predatory animal" shall include
9	any gray wolf not within an area of the state in which the
10	gray wolf is:

12	(II) Classified as a trophy game
13	animal by the game and fish commission pursuant to W.S.
14	23 1 304(a) 23-1-304(q)(i)(A) .

16	(x) "Trophy game animal" means:
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18	(B) From and after the date gray wolves are
19	removed from the list of experimental nonessential
20	population, endangered species or threatened species in
21	Wyoming as provided by W.S. 23-1-108:
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(I) "Trophy game animal" shall include 23 any gray wolf within those tracts of land within the 24

following described area, subject to modification as 1 authorized in this subdivision: northwest Wyoming beginning 2 at the east boundary of the Shoshone National Forest and 3 4 the Wyoming Montana state line; southerly along said forest 5 boundary to the common boundary between the Shoshone National Forest and the Wind River Indian Reservation; 6 westerly and then southeasterly along the Shoshone National 7 Forest boundary to the Union Pass Road (USFS Road 263); 8 southerly along said road until it intersects the north 9 10 boundary of the Upper Green River Cattle Association's 11 grazing allotment on forest service lands; following the eastern boundary of said allotment southerly and westerly 12 13 to the point it intersects the Bridger-Teton National Forest boundary; westerly along said forest boundary to 14 U.S. Highway 189-191; northwesterly along said highway to 15 U.S. Highway 26 89 191 at Hoback Junction; northerly along 16 said highway to Wyoming Highway 22; westerly along said 17 highway to the Wyoming Idaho state line; north along said 18 state line to the Wyoming-Montana state line; north and 19 then east along said state line to the east boundary of the 20 21 Shoshone National Forest. This described area may be diminished by rule of the game and fish commission if the 22 game and fish commission determines the diminution does not 23 24 impede the delisting of gray wolves and will facilitate

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Wyoming's management of wolves boundaries of Wyoming 1 designated as Yellowstone National Park, Grand Teton 2 3 National Park, John D. any gray wolf not within an area of the state in which the 1 2 gray wolf is: 3 4 (II) Classified as a trophy game 5 animal by the commission pursuant to W.S. $\frac{23-1-304}{(a)}$ 6 23-1-304(q)(i)(A). 7 (xii) "Trophy game animal" means: 8 9 (B) From and after the date gray wolves are 10 removed from the list of experimental nonessential 11 population, endangered species or threatened species in 12 Wyoming as provided by W.S. 23-1-108: 13 14 15 (I) "Trophy game animal" shall include any gray wolf within those tracts of land within the 16 following described area, subject to modification as 17 authorized in this subdivision: northwest Wyoming beginning 18 at the east boundary of the Shoshone National Forest and 19 20 the Wyoming Montana state line; southerly along said forest 21 boundary to the common boundary between the Shoshone 22 National Forest and the Wind River Indian Reservation; westerly and then southeasterly along the Shoshone National 23

Forest boundary to the Union Pass Road (USFS Road 263);

1	southerly along said road until it intersects the north
2	boundary of the Upper Green River Cattle Association's
3	grazing allotment on forest service lands; following the
4	eastern boundary of said allotment southerly and westerly

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8	(a) The commission is directed and empowered:
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10	(xxix) After the date gray wolves are removed
11	from the list of experimental nonessential population,
12	endangered species or threatened species in Wyoming as
13	provided by W.S. 23-1-108, to classify gray wolves as
14	predatory or trophy game animals in accordance with W.S.
15	23-1-304, and to regulate the number of gray wolves which
16	may be taken under a license issued under this act. or as
17	necessary to carry out the commission's duties under this
18	act.
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20	23-1-304. Classification of gray wolves.
21	
22	(a) The commission shall by rule and regulation
23	establish areas within the state where gray wolves are
24	classified as trophy game animals and set seasons and bag

limits within those areas. The areas designated, seasons 1 2 and bag limits shall be set annually in a manner the commission determines, through rule and regulation, only as 3 4 necessary to reasonably ensure at least seven (7) breeding 5 pairs of gray wolves are located in this state and primarily outside of Yellowstone National Park, Grand Teton 6 National Park and John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway 7 at the end of the current calendar year determine the 8 9 classification of gray wolves as provided in this section. In making this classification the commission shall rely 10 upon information provided by department personnel and shall 11 consult with the Wyoming animal damage management board 12 13 created by W.S. 11-6-303 and the director of the Wyoming 14 department of agriculture, and consider any additional information provided by that board and by that director. 15

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For purposes of this section "breeding pair" "pack" means an adult male and an adult female gray wolf raising at least two (2) pups of the year until December 31. The number of breeding pairs shall be certified by the department prior to January 31 of each year five (5) or more gray wolves traveling together. If a group of gray wolves consists of more than ten (10) animals known to be traveling together, the commission may, at its discretion,

1 recognize the number of packs within such a group to be

2 equal to the number of reproductively mature females

3 bearing young found within that group of wolves.

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5 (d) The department shall institute and maintain an population monitoring 6 active program of statewide. Population monitoring shall include the use of global 7 positioning systems and radio collaring of gray wolves, 8 9 including use of aerial tracking, necessary to accurately 10 determine the population and movement of gray wolves in the 11 state. The commission is authorized to enter into memoranda of understanding with the United States fish and wildlife 12 13 service or other federal agencies to fund the purchase of the necessary technology and to ensure accurate and 14 adequate monitoring of wolf population levels and movements 15 through global positioning systems and radio collar 16 17 tracking. In all areas of the state, except where otherwise provided, any person who harvests a wolf shall notify the 18 department where the harvest occurred within ten (10) days. 19 20 Any information regarding the number or nature of wolves 21 legally harvested within the state of Wyoming shall only be 22 released in its aggregate form and no information of a private or confidential nature shall be released without 23 24 the written consent of the person to whom the information

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1 may refer. Information identifying any person legally

2 harvesting a wolf within this state is solely for the use

3 of the department or appropriate law enforcement offices

4 and is not a public record for purposes of W.S. 16-4-201

5 through 16-4-205.

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7 (e) The department shall actively monitor big game

8 animal herd populations statewide to determine whether and

9 to what extent the gray wolf is negatively impacting big

10 game animal herds, and thereby hunting opportunities. To

11 the extent permitted by this title, and notwithstanding

12 other provisions of this title by those means authorized by

13 the commission, the department shall manage the gray wolf

14 population as necessary to ensure the long-term health and

15 viability of any big game animal herd that is being

16 threatened in this state.

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18 (q) The department shall provide to the commission at

19 least a quarterly monitoring report on the number of gray

20 wolf packs within this state and their general location.

21 Within thirty (30) days of receiving a department report

22 the commission shall at a public meeting:

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1	(i) Determine if there are less than seven (7)
2	packs of gray wolves located in this state and primarily
3	outside of Yellowstone National Park, Grand Teton National
4	Park and John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway and less
5	than fifteen (15) packs within this state, including
6	Yellowstone National Park, Grand Teton National Park and
7	John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway. If such a
8	determination is made:
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10	(A) The commission shall adopt rules and
11	regulations to classify the gray wolf as a trophy game
12	animal and prohibit the taking of gray wolves except as
13	provided by W.S. 23-3-115(c), within that area of the state
14	the commission determines is necessary to reasonably ensure
15	seven (7) packs of gray wolves are located in this state
16	and primarily outside of Yellowstone National Park, Grand
17	Teton National Park and John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial
18	Parkway at the end of the current calendar year;
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20	(B) At any time that gray wolves are
21	classified as trophy game animals outside of any area
22	specified in W.S. 23-1-101(a)(xii)(B)(I), the commission
23	shall:

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1	(I) Meet in public not less than once
2	every ninety (90) days to review the classification and
3	determine the need for its continuance;
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5	(II) In consultation with the director
6	of the Wyoming department of agriculture, upon receipt of
7	information from the department of agriculture, consider
8	the reclassification of wolves in all or a portion of such
9	area at the commission's next scheduled meeting, or at an
10	earlier meeting of the commission as the commission deems
11	desirable or necessary.
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13	(ii) Maintain the classification of gray wolves
14	as a predatory animal and trophy game animal as specified
15	in W.S. 23-1-101(a)(viii) and (xii)(B)(I), if it determines
16	there were at least seven (7) packs of gray wolves located
17	in this state and primarily outside of Yellowstone National
18	Park, Grand Teton National Park and John D. Rockefeller,
19	Jr. Memorial Parkway or at least fifteen (15) packs within
20	this state, including Yellowstone National Park, Grand
21	Teton National Park and John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial
22	Parkway as of the end of the preceding calendar quarter.
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1 23-3-115. Taking black bear, mountain lion, gray

2 wolf, bobcat, weasel, badger, squirrels or muskrat for

3 damaging property.

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5 The provisions of subsection (a) of this section relating to the taking of animals doing damage to private 6 property shall apply to gray wolves from and after the date 7 gray wolves are removed from the list of experimental 8 9 nonessential population, endangered species or threatened 10 species in Wyoming as provided by W.S. 23-1-108. The owner, 11 employee or lessee acting under authority of this section shall notify the department of the killing of a gray wolf 12 13 within an area of the state in which the gray wolf is classified as a trophy game animal. The notification shall 14 be made within ten (10) days of the kill unless the gray 15 wolf was taken in an area where wolves have been classified 16 17 trophy game animals pursuant to W.S. $\frac{23-1-304}{(a)}$ 23-1-304(q)(i)(A) in which case the notification shall be 18 19 made within seventy-two (72) hours.

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- 21 Section 2. W.S. 11-6-302(b), 23-1-101(b), 23-1-109
- 22 and 23-1-304(g) through (p) and 2007 Wyoming Session Laws,
- 23 Chapter 168, Section 4 are repealed.

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Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
