1 AN ACT relating to school facilities; specifying and clarifying factors impacting capital construction remedies 2 addressing district facility needs; and providing for an 3 effective date. 4 5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 6 7 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-15-117(a)(ii) and (b) through (d) 8 is amended to read: 9 10 21-15-117. Annual evaluation of school buildings and 11 facilities; remediation schedule; needs prioritization; 12 combining facilities; implementation of remedy. 13 14 (a) Through the identification of school building and 15 facility conditions and needs provided by the assessment 16

conducted and maintained under W.S. 1 21-15-115, and a 2 comparison of the identified conditions and needs with the 3 established statewide building adequacy standards and the 4 district facility plans developed under W.S. 21-15-116, the 5 commission shall in coordination and cooperation with the districts, evaluate the adequacy of school buildings and 6 facilities within local school districts, and based upon 7 this evaluation, establish a schedule for building and 8 9 facility remediation. Remediation shall bring all buildings and facilities to conditions such that over time, only 10 11 routine maintenance is required to maintain building The schedule shall identify and prioritize 12 adequacy. 13 building and facility remedies on a statewide basis, based 14 upon the following:

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Measures of building condition, educational 16 (ii) 17 suitability and technology readiness, including computed building capacity, as established by the commission, 18 19 wherein condition accounts for fifty percent (50%) of building adequacy assessment, educational suitability and 20 21 technology readiness accounts for thirty percent (30%), and 22 building capacity accounts for twenty percent (20%), which over time, bring statewide school buildings and facilities 23 24 to targeted adequate levels prescribed by the commission;

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2 Subject to subsection (c) of this section, the (b) 3 commission shall for each building and facility remedy 4 scheduled under subsection (a) of this section, determine 5 the most cost effective method of remediation of building and facility needs to deliver quality educational services 6 ensure compliance with the statewide 7 and adequacy standards. For any scheduled remedy for which major 8 9 building and facility repair and replacement payments under W.S. 21-15-109 are not sufficient to remedy the scheduled 10 need, as determined by the commission, the commission shall 11 determine if the remedy requires capital outlay. 12

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14 (c) In determining the most cost effective method in 15 meeting capital construction needs in order to deliver 16 quality educational services, the commission in 17 consultation with the select committee on school 18 facilities:₇

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20 (i) May recommend consolidating educational 21 facilities within, between or among school districts. The 22 legislature shall approve any consolidation of educational 23 facilities between two (2) or more school districts;-

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1	(ii) Shall through guidelines developed in
2	consultation with the select committee, restrict capital
3	construction remedies addressing district building and
4	facility needs based upon proximity of location to existing
5	school buildings, addressing both urban and rural locations
6	and geographical conditions;
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8	(iii) Shall by rule and regulation, establish
9	clear and transparent requirements limiting capital
10	construction remedies until all other major maintenance and
11	renovation alternatives have been exhausted and
12	conclusively eliminated;
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14 <u>(iv) Shall prohibit capital construction</u>
15 <u>remedies based solely on accommodation of school district</u>
16 <u>grade configuration decisions.</u>

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(d) In determining building and facility remedies
under subsection (b) of this section, in developing
criteria and procedures for site analysis under W.S.
21-15-114(a)(xii) and in developing district facility plans
under W.S. 21-15-116 and otherwise administering this act,
the commission shall adopt the remedy that is in the best
financial and educational interests of the state, taking

into consideration the most efficient and cost effective 1 approach in order to deliver quality educational services 2 and address building and facility need. Subject to 3 4 subsection (c) of this section, expenditures from the 5 school capital construction account shall be for necessary and related costs to implement efficient and cost effective 6 building and facility remedies required to deliver quality 7 educational services. In making determinations under this 8 9 paragraph, the commission shall take into consideration the 10 effects of the proposed activity on the local community. 11 The commission shall implement this subsection in carrying out building and facility remedies and shall, giving proper 12 13 consideration to the prevention of unnecessary delays in 14 preceding with a remedy, establish a process to work with other political subdivisions of the state in implementing 15 this subsection. 16

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18 Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon 19 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 20 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 21 Constitution.
