## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to administration of the government and the
- 2 Wyoming health care commission; providing for legislative
- 3 liaisons to the commission; amending the duties of the

- 5 commission; providing an appropriation; and providing for
- 6 an effective date.

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8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 10 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-2-2801(b), 9-2-2802(a)(i),
- 11 9-2-2803(a) and by creating new subsections (g) and (h) and
- 12 9-2-2804 are amended to read:

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- 14 9-2-2801. Health care commission created; membership;
- 15 salary; meetings; advisory committees.

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1	(b) The commission shall consist of eleven (11)
2	members appointed by the governor. In addition, the
3	director of the department of health or the director's
4	designee and the insurance commissioner or the
5	commissioner's designee shall be ex officio members of the
6	commission. <u>In addition, the speaker of the house shall</u>
7	appoint two (2) representatives, with not more than one (1)
8	member from the same political party, and the president of
9	the senate shall appoint two (2) senators, with not more
LO	than one (1) member from the same political party, to serve
L1	as liaisons to facilitate planning and communication among
L2	the commission, the joint labor, health and social services
L3	interim committee and the legislature. Legislative
L4	liaisons shall be entitled to attend commission meetings
L5	but shall have no vote.

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9-2-2802. Director; appointment; duties; additional staff; qualifications.

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20 (a) The governor, with the consent of the commission, 21 shall appoint a director who shall serve at the pleasure of 22 the commission. The director shall:

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1 (i) Serve as administrative head of the 2 commission and as a liaison among the governor's office, 3 the legislature, the commission and the public; 4 5 9-2-2803. Health care commission duties; report; open meetings; attorney general to represent; rulemaking. 6 7 In carrying out the directives of the 8 (a) 9 legislature, the commission shall develop strategies to improve health care and reduce health care costs for 10 Wyoming citizens by holding public meetings throughout the 11 state, hearing from experts and other interested parties, 12 13 studying and researching other states' actions on health care reform, studying and utilizing Wyoming data and 14 considering current and past efforts. and future 15 possibilities that can be useful in decision making by 16 17 addressing issues related to health care access, quality 18 and cost. 19 (g) By July 1 of each year, the commission shall 20 21 provide to the joint labor, health and social services interim committee a list of prioritized recommendations to 22

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Section 2. There is appropriated five hundred fortyseven thousand one hundred forty-seven dollars
(\$547,147.00) from the general fund to the health care

7 commission. This appropriation shall be for the period

8 beginning with the effective date of this act and ending

9 June 30, 2010. This appropriation shall only be expended

10 for the purpose of commission studies and administration.

11 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this

12 appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any

13 other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds

14 remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided

15 by law on June 30, 2010. An amount equal to twice this

16 appropriation shall be included in the department's 2011-

17 2012 standard biennial budget request.

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19 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2009.
