## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to the administration of government;
- 2 establishing a program to promote child care and early
- 3 childhood education; providing for business and financial
- 4 services to child care and early childhood education
- 5 providers; providing for administration of the program;
- 6 providing for an advisory council; providing for fellowship
- 7 positions; providing rulemaking authority; requiring
- 8 reports; providing appropriations; and providing for an
- 9 effective date.

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11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 13 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-2-2608 and 9-2-2609 are created to
- 14 read:

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9-2-2608. Wyoming first children's finance program; 1 2 purpose; definitions.

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(a) The legislature finds and declares that: 4

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There is in this state, a critical need for 6 (i) quality and affordable child care and early childhood 7 education; 8

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10 (ii) It is in the public interest of 11 citizens of this state to enhance and expand child care and early childhood education in order to promote quality and 12 13 affordable child care and early childhood development of the children of Wyoming; 14

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16 (iii) It is the purpose of this article to 17 and expand child care and early childhood education, to encourage private investment in child care 18 and early childhood education, to promote availability of 19 quality, affordable child care 20 and early childhood 21 education throughout Wyoming and to provide for cooperation 22 between private nonprofit child care organizations, family child care and early childhood education providers and the 23 24 department to create, enhance and expand the quality and

affordability of child care and early childhood education 1 2 opportunities in Wyoming; 3 4 (iv) This article constitutes a valid public 5 purpose, of primary benefit to all citizens of the state of Wyoming. 6 7 (b) As used in this article: 8 9 10 (i) "Contractor" means the nonprofit organization contracting with the department to provide 11 assistance with childcare and early childhood education 12 13 development; 14 15 (ii) "Department" means the department of workforce services; 16 17 (iii) "Director" means the director of 18 the department of workforce services; 19 20 21 (iv) "Growth fund advisory council" means the 22 first children's finance program growth fund advisory council; 23

L4	(a) The department shall establish and administer a
L5	Wyoming first children's finance program as provided by
L6	this section and W.S. 9-2-2608. The department may
L7	promulgate rules and regulations necessary for the
L8	implementation of this program.

20	(b) The purpose of this program is to:
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22	(i) Provide business planning assistance to
2.3	child care and early childhood education providers:

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1 (ii) Provide assistance and support to enhance

2 and expand child care and early childhood education

3 providers.

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5 (c) The department shall contract with any contractor

6 in accordance with the purposes of this section. The

7 contractor shall have demonstrated the ability to analyze

8 financing projects, have knowledge of other sources of

9 public and private financing for child care and early

10 childhood education providers, have a relationship with

11 regional resource and referral programs and have knowledge

12 about child care and early childhood education,

13 development, improvement and financing. The contractor

14 shall provide nonstate funds to be used as a revolving loan

15 fund accessible to Wyoming providers of not less than five

16 hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00).

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18 (d) The department may enter into cooperative

19 agreements with the Eastern Shoshone Tribe and the Northern

20 Arapaho Tribe in order to promote the purposes of this

21 section.

22

23 (e) The program shall include a growth fund program

24 to provide for a three (3) year investment for business

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1 planning assistance to early care and education providers

2 that are in a growth mode and committed to quality

3 improvements. The criteria for the growth fund assistance

4 shall be established by the department in rules based upon

5 recommendations from the growth fund advisory council.

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(f) There is created a first children's finance 7 program state advisory council. The state advisory council 8 9 shall consist of not more than twelve (12) persons who are child care or early childhood providers, parents 10 11 leaders and appointed by the director business consultation with the Wyoming early childhood partnership 12 The state advisory council members 13 and the contractor. 14 shall select one (1) member as chairman. The state advisory council shall meet at least twice per year or upon 15 the call of the chairman. The state advisory council shall 16 17 provide advice and make recommendations to the contractor to help connect the contractor and providers with available 18 resources and to ensure the alignment and integration of 19 child care and early childhood education programs with 20 21 other related services in Wyoming.

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23 (g) There is created a first children's finance 24 program growth fund advisory council. The growth fund

advisory council shall consist of not more than eight (8) 1 persons, with no more than four (4) members who are also 2 3 members of the state advisory council, appointed by the chairman of the state advisory council. The other council 4 5 members shall be appointed by the director upon consultation with the Wyoming early childhood partnership 6 and the contractor. The growth fund advisory council shall 7 advise the growth fund program with review and approval by 8 9 the department. The growth fund council shall select a 10 minimum of five (5) provider programs per year to receive 11 grants, loans or a combination of grants and loans, based upon an availability from nonstate funds. The growth fund 12 13 council shall consider business planning, business 14 equipment and administrative expenses in the management of the provider program in determining eligible programs and 15 eliqible costs. 16

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(h) Members of the state advisory council and the growth fund advisory council that are government employees or public officials shall not receive a salary but shall be considered on official business of their agency when performing duties as members of their advisory council and shall receive reimbursement for necessary travel and per diem expenses in the manner and amount provided by their

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1 agency. Other state advisory council and growth fund

2 advisory council members shall receive per diem and travel

3 expenses in the amount provided in W.S. 28-5-101 when

4 traveling to and from advisory council meetings and shall

5 only receive salary in the same amount as legislators for

6 actual advisory council meeting days.

7

8 (j) There is created a fellowship program through the

9 University of Wyoming to promote child care and early

10 childhood educational business leadership. Two (2)

11 graduate student fellows may be recruited and mentored in

12 financing, business management, technology and

13 communications.

14

15 (k) The department shall submit an annual report to

16 the joint labor, health and social services interim

17 committee and the joint appropriations interim committee,

18 on or before October 1, beginning in 2010. The report

19 shall include:

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21 (i) A statement of all rules and regulations

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22 adopted to further the purposes of this section;

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(ii) An evaluation of the following based on 1 2 performance measures established by the department: 3 4 (A) Any critical child care and early 5 childhood educational information collected by the department; 6 7 (B) Any fiscal and performance information 8 9 on the contractor; 10 (C) Any performance information on 11 the providers; 12 13 Any needs of the community to 14 (D) 15 served. 16 (iii) A comprehensive review of the results of 17 the contractor in meeting the goals of the contractor as 18 defined in this section; 19 20 (iv) An analysis of the progress from each 21

provider in the growth fund program;

## 5 Section 3.

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There is appropriated five hundred twenty-two 7 (a) thousand dollars (\$522,000.00) from the general fund to the 8 9 Wyoming department of workforce services. This appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the 10 effective date of this act and ending June 30, 2010. 11 Notwithstanding any other provision 12 of law, this 13 appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any any unexpended, unobligated funds 14 other purpose and remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided 15 by law on June 30, 2010. This appropriation shall only be 16 17 expended for the purpose of enhancing and expanding child care and early childhood education as follows: 18

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(i) One hundred forty-four thousand dollars (\$144,000.00) for salary and benefits for an additional full-time position for a state director and an additional full-time position for an administrative assistant;

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(ii) One hundred thousand dollars ($100,000.00)
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    for program related contract services with a nonprofit
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    organization;
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             (iii) Seventy-one thousand dollars ($71,000.00)
    for office administrative expenses;
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              (iv) Sixty thousand dollars ($60,000.00) for

    graduate student fellowships to assist with the program;
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              (v) Fifty thousand dollars ($50,000.00) for
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    consultant services to assist five (5) providers;
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              (vi) Fifty thousand dollars ($50,000.00) for
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    administration assistance from the contract nonprofit
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    provider;
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              (vii) Fifteen thousand dollars ($15,000.00) for
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    support of the first children's finance state advisory
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    council and growth fund advisory council;
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              (viii) Ten thousand dollars ($10,000.00) for
    contingency funding;
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(ix) Twenty-two thousand dollars (\$22,000.00) 1 2 for one (1) time office set-up expenses. 3 (b) The Wyoming department of workforce services 4 5 shall include a request in its 2011-2012 budget for one million four hundred forty-six thousand dollars 6 (\$1,446,000.00) from the general fund for the purpose of 7 enhancing and expanding child care and early childhood 8 9 education as follows: 10 11 (i) Two hundred eighty-eight thousand dollars (\$288,000.00) for salary and benefits for the 12 state 13 director and the administrative assistant; 14 15 (ii) Two hundred fifty-eight thousand dollars (\$258,000.00) for two (2) additional full-time positions 16 17 for a program manager and a communications manager; 18 (iii) Two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000.00) 19 for program related contract services with the nonprofit 20 21 organization; 22 hundred dollars 23 (iv) One eighty thousand

(\$180,000.00) for office administrative expenses;

2 (v) One hundred twenty thousand dollars

3 (\$120,000.00) for graduate student fellowships to assist

4 with the program;

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6 (vi) One hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00)

7 for consultant services to assist ten (10) providers for

8 fiscal year 2011;

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10 (vii) One hundred fifty thousand dollars

11 (\$150,000.00) for consultant services to assist fifteen

12 (15) providers for fiscal year 2012;

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14 (viii) One hundred thousand dollars

15 (\$100,000.00) for administration assistance from the

16 contract nonprofit organization;

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18 (ix) Thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) for

19 support of the first children's finance state advisory

20 council and the growth fund advisory council;

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22 (x) Twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) for

23 contingency funding.

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Section 4. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
