CARDIOVASCULAR DISEASE EDUCATION AND OUTREACH INITIATIVE 1 2 35-25-301. Short title. 3 4 5 This article shall be known and may be cited as the "Cardiovascular Disease Education and Outreach Initiative 6 Act". 7 8 35-25-302. Cardiovascular disease education 9 and 10 outreach program. 11 The department of health shall develop a 12 (a) 13 comprehensive cardiovascular education and outreach 14 program. The goal of the program shall be to reduce, through education, prevention and behavior change, the 15 number of people with diabetes who are at risk for 16 17 developing cardiovascular disease. For those individuals who are diagnosed with diabetes, the goal shall be to 18 diagnostic, therapeutic and 19 provide behavioral interventions that are evidence based and scientifically 20 21 proven. The comprehensive cardiovascular disease education 22 and outreach program shall include the following features:

1 (i) An education and outreach component to 2 demonstrate the interaction of heart disease and diabetes 3 and steps a person can take to prevent both conditions;

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5 (ii) Evidence based early detection, screening, 6 diagnosis and treatment of diabetes related cardiovascular 7 disease;

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9 (iii) Research and data collection, including the development and use of a computer software based 10 11 quality care monitoring system that is made available to health care providers, diabetes educators 12 and cardiac 13 rehabilitation facilities for the monitoring of diabetes patient care and collection of data related to blood 14 pressure, blood lipids and glucosylated hemoglobin levels; 15

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17 (iv) Intervention using a team approach with a 18 team comprised of a registered nurse, registered dietician 19 and a specialist in data collection and analysis;

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(v) Use of Internet based or closed circuit video systems to disseminate information regarding new, scientifically based methods of diabetes management and cardiovascular disease prevention;

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2 extent appropriate, coordination (vi) То the 3 with and use of any educational or other supportive programs of nationally recognized heart and diabetes 4 5 associations.

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(b) financing and implementing the 7 In program established pursuant to subsection (a) of this section the 8 9 department shall coordinate with and consider the use of the Medicaid program, the child health insurance program 10 and any other state funded program providing health care or 11 This health education. section does not constitute 12 13 authorization to expand the services and eligibilities of the Medicaid program which requires specific legislative 14 The department 15 authorization. may recommend such authorization where appropriate. 16

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(c) The department may contract with one (1) or more 18 develop and 19 third parties to implement the program 20 authorized by this section. Any contract awarded under this section shall be awarded on the basis of competitive 21 bids and shall include specific requirements relating to 22 outcome based evaluation. 23

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(d) Subject to the restriction of subsection (b) of 1 this section, the department may accept state, federal, 2 3 local and nongovernmental funds for developing and implementing the program established pursuant to this 4 5 section. 6 35-25-303. Rulemaking authority; legislative report. 7 8 9 (a) The department shall, in accordance with the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act, promulgate rules and 10 11 regulations as appropriate to implement this article. 12 13 (b) The department shall annually report on its activities, program outcomes, conclusions and goals under 14 this article to the joint labor, health and social services 15 interim committee and the joint appropriations interim 16 17 committee. The report shall be due by October 1 of each 18 year. 19 20 35-25-304. Repeal. 21 22 This article is repealed effective July 1, 2012. 23 Section 2. 24

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2 There is appropriated two hundred seventy-five (a) 3 thousand dollars (\$275,000.00) from the tobacco settlement 4 income account to the department of health. This 5 appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the effective date of this act and ending June 30, 2010. 6 This appropriation shall only be expended for the purpose of the 7 cardiovascular education and outreach initiative created by 8 9 this act. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this 10 appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any 11 other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided 12 13 by law on June 30, 2010. An amount equal to two (2) times 14 this appropriation shall be included in the department's 2011-2012 standard biennial budget request. 15 16 17 (b) The department of health is authorized three (3) at-will contract positions for the purposes of this act. 18 19 20 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2009. 21 22 (END)
