U.S. constitutional convention-repeal.

A BILL

for

A JOINT RESOLUTION to repeal requests made to Congress to
call a convention for the purpose of proposing amendments
to the Constitution of the United States.

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5 WHEREAS, on February 23, 1939, the Wyoming Legislature 6 approved House Joint Memorial No. 6 requesting Congress to 7 call a Constitutional Convention to propose an amendment to 8 the United States Constitution to provide limitations on 9 taxes on incomes, gifts and inheritances and to repeal the 10 Sixteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution; and

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12 WHEREAS, on February 26, 1959, the Wyoming Legislature 13 approved House Joint Resolution No. 4 requesting Congress 14 to approve and submit to the states for ratification, or to 15 call a Constitutional Convention to propose an amendment to

the United States Constitution to abolish personal income,
estate and gift taxes and to prohibit the federal
government from engaging in business in competition with
its citizens; and

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WHEREAS, on February 21, 1961, the Wyoming Legislature 6 7 approved House Joint Resolution No. 7 requesting Congress to call a Constitutional Convention to propose an amendment 8 9 to the United States Constitution to provide that the 10 federal government expenditures during any fiscal year may 11 not exceed the estimated receipts of the federal government for that fiscal year, except for trust fund expenditures 12 13 and receipts, unless a substantial majority of the 14 Congress, on recommendation of the President and because of 15 war or other grave national emergency, votes to suspend the limitation on expenditures for a specified period of time; 16 17 and

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19 WHEREAS, on February 9, 1963, the Wyoming Legislature 20 approved House Joint Memorial No. 13 requesting Congress to 21 call a Constitutional Convention to propose an amendment to 22 the United States Constitution to prohibit the federal 23 government from restricting or limiting, through

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1 legislative or judicial action, any state in the 2 apportionment of the representation of its legislature; and 3 4 WHEREAS, on February 14, 1963, the Wyoming Legislature 5 approved Senate Joint Resolution No. 4 requesting Congress to call a Constitutional Convention to propose an amendment 6 7 to the United States Constitution to provide for a Court of 8 the Union; and 9 WHEREAS, on February 15, 1963, the Wyoming Legislature 10 11 approved House Joint Memorial No. 14 requesting Congress to call a Constitutional Convention to propose an amendment to 12 13 Article V of the United States Constitution which would 14 provide a change in the procedure for proposing a constitutional amendment to the United States Constitution; 15 16 and 17 WHEREAS, on February 14, 1975, the Wyoming Legislature 18 19 approved House Joint Resolution No. 4 requesting Congress 20 to call a Constitutional Convention to propose an amendment 21 to the United States Constitution to prohibit Congress, the

22 President or any agency of the federal government from 23 withholding or withdrawing federal funds as a means of 24 requiring a state to implement federal policies which

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1 neither Congress, the President or the agency has the power 2 or authority to impose or implement directly by its own 3 action; and

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5 WHEREAS, on February 17, 1977, the Wyoming Legislature approved House Joint Resolution No. 12 requesting Congress 6 to approve and submit to the states for ratification, or to 7 call a Constitutional Convention to propose an amendment to 8 9 United Constitution provide the States to that 10 appropriations of money made by Congress of any fiscal year 11 may not exceed the total estimated revenues for that fiscal year, except when a national emergency is proclaimed by the 12 13 President and concurred in by two-thirds (2/3) of the 14 members elected to each house of Congress; and

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WHEREAS, on February 28, 1979, the Wyoming Legislature 16 17 approved Senate Joint Resolution No. 4 requesting Congress to call a Constitutional Convention to propose an amendment 18 19 to the United States Constitution to provide that taxes or 20 expenditures by the federal government may not exceed an 21 amount equal to the taxes or expenditures for the preceding 22 fiscal year, computed on a per capita basis, increased by 23 the percentage increase in the Consumer Price Index and the 24 national population for the preceding fiscal year, except

1 when a national emergency is proclaimed by the President 2 and concurred in by two-thirds (2/3) of the members elected 3 to each house of Congress; and 4 5 WHEREAS, a Constitutional Convention called and convened 6 for any one purpose could result in a complete rewriting of 7 the United States Constitution with no rules or precedent 8 whatsoever to follow; and 9 WHEREAS, the convening of a Constitutional Convention 10 11 during these troubled times represents a clear and present 12 danger to our established system of justice, to the common 13 defense of our nation, to our general welfare and to the 14 ordered form of liberty which we have inherited from our 15 forefathers, cherished for ourselves and earnestly desire to defend and conserve for our posterity; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, these rights and privileges were endowed unto us 19 by our Creator; and 20 21 WHEREAS, these clear and present dangers far outweigh any 22 possible benefit of convening a Constitutional Convention 23 at this time; and 24 5

1 WHEREAS, we, as members of the Legislature of the State of 2 Wyoming, have sworn a solemn oath to support, obey and 3 defend the United States Constitution against all enemies, 4 both foreign and domestic; and 5 WHEREAS, Congress has not called a convention for the 6 7 purpose of amending the United States Constitution as 8 requested. 9 Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved By The Legislature of the 10 11 State of Wyoming, a majority of all the members of each house, voting separately, concurring therein: 12 13 Section 1. That House Joint Memorial No. 6 approved 14 by the Legislature on February 23, 1939; House Joint 15 Resolution No. 4 approved by the Legislature on February 16 17 26, 1959; House Joint Resolution No. 7 approved by the Legislature on February 21, 1961; House Joint Memorial No. 18 19 13 approved by the Legislature on February 9, 1963; Senate 20 Joint Resolution No. 4 approved by the Legislature on 21 February 14, 1963; House Joint Memorial No. 14 approved by

Legislature on February 15, 1963; House 23 Resolution No. 4 approved by the Legislature on February 24 14, 1975; House Joint Resolution No. 12 approved by the

1 Legislature on February 17, 1977; Senate Joint Resolution 2 No. 4 approved by the Legislature on February 28, 1979; and 3 any other previous applications to the Congress of the 4 United States made by the Wyoming Legislature pursuant to 5 Article V of the United States Constitution for the calling of a constitutional convention for any purpose, limited or 6 7 general, are hereby, both individually and collectively, 8 repealed.

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10 Section 2. That certified copies of this Joint 11 Resolution be transmitted by the Secretary of State to the 12 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of 13 Representatives of the Congress of the United States, and 14 to each member of the Wyoming Congressional delegation.
