A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the Wyoming Occupational Health and

2 Safety Act; providing for an increase in fines and civil

- 3 penalties as specified; providing for periodic adjustment
- 4 of civil penalties; and providing for an effective date.

6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 27-11-107(b) through (d), (f), (g)
- 9 and by creating a new subsection (j) is amended to read:

11 **27-11-107.** Penalty.

- 13 (b) Any employer willfully and knowingly violating
- 14 any of the provisions of this act, any safety and health
- 15 standards, rules or regulations promulgated under this act

1 or any existing rule or regulation governing the conditions 2 of employment promulgated by the commission may be assessed 3 a civil penalty of not less than five thousand dollars 4 (\$5,000.00) eight thousand dollars (\$8,000.00) nor more 5 than seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000.00) one hundred twenty thousand dollars (\$120,000.00) for each violation, 6 provided that a lesser penalty may be imposed by the 7 commission. If the violation causes the death of an 8 9 employee, the civil penalty amounts shall be increased to 10 not less than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) nor more 11 than two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000.00) for the violation, except that for an employer with twenty-five 12 13 (25) or fewer employees the minimum penalty shall not be 14 less than twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) for the 15 violation.

17 Any employer violating any provision of this act, any health and safety standards or rules and regulations promulgated under this act or any existing rule regulation governing the conditions of employment promulgated by the commission, the violation specifically determined to be of a serious nature, shall be assessed a civil penalty of not more than seven thousand dollars (\$7,000.00) twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000.00) for the 24

1 violation. If the violation causes the death of an

2 employee, the civil penalty amounts shall be increased to

3 not less than twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) nor more

4 than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) for the violation,

5 except that for an employer with twenty-five (25) or fewer

6 employees the minimum penalty shall not be less than ten

7 thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) for the violation.

9 (d) Any employer violating any provision of this act, any health and safety standards or rules and regulations 10 11 promulgated under this act or any existing rule or governing conditions 12 regulation the of employment promulgated by the commission, the violation determined not 13 to be of a serious nature, may be assessed a civil penalty 14 of not more than seven thousand dollars (\$7,000.00) twelve 15 thousand dollars (\$12,000.00) for each offense as noted in 16 the notice of violation. If the violation causes the death 17 of an employee, the civil penalty amounts shall be 18 19 increased to not less than twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) nor than fifty thousand 20 more dollars 21 (\$50,000.00) for the violation, except that for an employer with twenty-five (25) or fewer employees the minimum 22 penalty shall not be less than ten thousand dollars 23 (\$10,000.00) for the violation. 24

(f) Any employer who violates any of the posting requirements, as prescribed under the provisions of this act, may be assessed a civil penalty of up to seven thousand dollars (\$7,000.00) twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000.00) for each violation.

9 which a notice of violation has been issued, which notice of violation is not contested or appealed under W.S. 10 27-11-104 and 27-11-106, initiated by the employer, may be 11 assessed a civil penalty of not more than seven thousand 12 dollars (\$7,000.00) twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000.00) 13 for each day the failure or violation continues. If the 14 violation causes the death of an employee, the civil 15 penalty amounts shall be increased to not less than twenty 16 17 thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) nor more than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) for the violation, except that for an 18 19 employer with twenty-five (25) or fewer employees the minimum penalty shall not be less than ten thousand dollars 20 21 (\$10,000.00) for the violation.

23 <u>(j) Amounts provided under this section for civil</u>
24 penalties shall be adjusted by the commission at least once

1 during each four (4) year period beginning July 1, 2010 to

2 account for the percentage increase or decrease in the

3 consumer price index for all urban consumers during that

4 period.

6 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2010.
