## HOUSE BILL NO. HB0047

State parks-user fee program.

Sponsored by: Joint Travel, Recreation, Wildlife and Cultural Resources Interim Committee

## A BILL

for

AN ACT relating to state parks; providing for user fees to 1 be collected at the time of vehicle registrations; 2 providing for a waiver of the additional fee; providing for 3 rulemaking; providing for distribution and use of 4 additional fee; eliminating collection of daily use fees at 5 state parks, historic sites, state recreation areas and 6 state archeological sites for Wyoming residents; 7 providing for an effective date. 8

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10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 12 **Section 1.** W.S. 31-3-101(a) by creating a new
- 13 paragraph (iv), 31-3-103 by creating a new subsection (m)
- 14 and 36-4-121(a)(intro), (i), (iii), (iv), by creating a new
- 15 paragraph (xvii), (h) and (n) are amended to read:

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1 31-3-101. Registration fees; exemptions.

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3 (a) Except as otherwise provided, the following fees 4 shall accompany each application for the registration of a 5 vehicle:

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7 (iv) A state parks, historic sites, recreation area and archeological site user fee of five dollars 8 9 (\$5.00) shall be collected for all passenger cars registering under subparagraph (ii) (A) of this subsection 10 11 and noncommercial vehicles registering under subparagraph (ii) (E) of this subsection at the time of registration. A 12 13 person who registers such a vehicle may, at the time of 14 annual registration make a written election not to pay the five dollar (\$5.00) state parks user fee authorized under 15 this paragraph. If a written election is made, the fee 16 17 required in this paragraph shall not be collected. department shall, by rule and regulation, prescribe a 18 19 system to be implemented by county treasurers that will clearly notify the applicant of his right to check a box 20 21 and thereby elect not to pay the fee.

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23 31-3-103. Distribution of fees; refunds.

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1 (m) The fees collected pursuant to W.S. 31-3-101(a)(iv) shall be distributed to a special revenue 2 3 fund to be deposited as follows: 4 5 (i) Fifty percent (50%) shall be deposited in an operation and maintenance account within the special 6 revenue fund for purposes of providing for operation and 7 maintenance at state parks, recreation areas, 8 9 archaeological sites and historic sites; and 10 11 (ii) Fifty percent (50%) shall be deposited in 12 the capital construction account created by W.S. 13 36-4-121(h). 14 36-4-121. Permits to use state parks, recreation 15 areas and historic sites. 16 17 The department of state parks and cultural 18 (a) resources shall offer for sale permits that allow use of 19 20 the state parks, recreation areas, archeological sites and 21 historic sites. Except as otherwise provided by law, daily 22 use permits shall be required at Glendo, Guernsey, Curt Gowdy, Edness Kimball Wilkins, Buffalo Bill, Boysen, 23 24 Seminoe and Keyhole state parks and Fort Bridger, South

1 Pass City, Trail End, Fort Fetterman and Fort Phil Kearney 2 state historic sites, and Hawk Springs state recreation area. The department may establish voluntary pay stations 3 4 at Bear River and Hot Springs state parks to allow users of 5 those parks to make voluntary contributions for the use of the state parks. Persons who enter or use Bear River or Hot 6 Springs state park without paying daily use fees shall not 7 be subject to the penalties provided for in subsection (j) 8 9 this section. Overnight camping permits shall of required at Boysen, Buffalo Bill, Curt Gowdy, Glendo, 10 11 Guernsey, Keyhole, Seminoe and Sinks Canyon state parks, Connor Battlefield and Fort Fetterman state historic site 12 13 sites, Medicine Lodge state archeological site and Hawk 14 Springs state recreation area by the department during the entire calendar year. Except for the lifetime permit issued 15 without cost pursuant to subsection (n) of this section or 16 17 as otherwise provided by law, the cost of the permits authorized under this section shall be: 18

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(i) Thirty three dollars (\$33.00) per calendar

21 year for a resident annual daily use permit and Fifty-three

22 dollars (\$53.00) for a nonresident annual daily use permit

23 to designated state parks, historic sites, archeological

24 sites and recreation areas, valid for the holder and

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the holder's vehicle, provided resident 1 occupants of permits purchased pursuant to this paragraph between 2 3 January 1 through February 15 of each year shall cost 4 twenty seven dollars (\$27.00) and nonresident permits 5 purchased during the same period pursuant to this paragraph between January 1 through February 15 of each year shall 6 cost forty-six dollars (\$46.00); 7 8 9 (iii) Except as provided under paragraph (a) (v) of this section, four dollars (\$4.00) for residents and six 10 11 dollars (\$6.00) for nonresidents for the daily use fee for designated state parks, archeological sites and recreation 12 13 areas, valid for the date of purchase for the holder and occupants of the holder's vehicle and for the holder 14 entering the park or area by bicycle, horseback or on foot; 15 16 17 (iv) Except as provided under paragraph (a) (v) this section, two dollars (\$2.00) per person for 18 residents and four dollars 19 (\$4.00) per person nonresidents for the daily use fee for designated state 20 21 historic sites, valid for the date of purchase for the 22 holder only. The fee is not required for persons under the age of eighteen (18) years; 23

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1 (xvii) Residents shall not be required to pay a 2 daily use fee for access to state parks, historic sites, 3 recreation areas or archeological sites. Other fees for 4 the use of state parks, such as overnight camping fees, are 5 still chargeable and may be collected by the department. 6 The funds received by the department from the 7 (h) sale of the permits under this section and received 8 9 pursuant to W.S. 31-3-103(m)(ii) shall be deposited in a capital construction account and may be expended by the 10 11 department for capital construction projects, maintenance, and site interpretation such as exhibits, 12 13 signage and displays and for the administration of the fee program including the cost of purchasing permits, fee 14 envelopes, signs and administering reservations as approved 15 by the legislature. 16 17 Any resident disabled veteran who receives fifty 18 service 19 (50%) or more connected disability percent 20 compensation from the United States department of veteran's 21 affairs may apply to the department for a lifetime permit 22 authorizing the use of state parks, recreation areas, archeological sites and historic sites without payment of 23 any daily use, overnight camping or other fee authorized to 24

1 be charged pursuant to this section. Only one (1) permit

2 shall be issued to any qualified applicant under this

3 subsection and shall be valid for the applicant and for all

4 occupants of the applicant's vehicle. In addition to

5 information and other application procedural requirements

6 prescribed by rule and regulation of the department,

7 application for the lifetime permit shall include proof of

8 residency and certification of the service connected

9 disability. The lifetime permit is valid as long as the

10 holder is a Wyoming resident. A permit under this

11 subsection shall be issued to an eligible applicant without

12 the imposition of a fee.

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14 Section 2. This act is effective January 1, 2012.
