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10	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:			
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12	Section 1. W.S. 9-1-224 is created to read:			
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14	9-1-224. Executive orders; requirements; effect.			
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16	(a) Each executive order issued by the governor shall			
17	be serially numbered for each calendar year and shall be			

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effective and expire as provided in this section. An
 executive order shall be effective only after signature by
 the governor, countersignature by and filing with the
 secretary of state. The secretary of state shall keep a
 permanent register and file of executive orders.

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shall executive order 7 (b) An specify the constitutional or statutory provision pursuant to which it 8 9 is issued and the constitutional or statutory provision 10 which it seeks to implement. An executive order shall be 11 subject to the provisions of the Wyoming Regulatory Takings Act, and shall not issue if it is determined by the 12 13 governor that it may result in a taking of private property without just compensation or in violation of due process. 14 executive order which issued and 15 is subsequently An determined by a final nonappealable order of a court of 16 17 competent jurisdiction to result in a taking of private property without just compensation or violation of due 18 19 process shall be void.

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(c) An executive order shall prescribe a date after which it shall cease to be effective, which shall be within four (4) years of the filing of the order, and if no such date is contained in the order, then the order shall cease

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1 to be effective four (4) years from the date it was filed with the secretary of state, unless renewed by subsequent 2 3 executive order. The governor may modify or repeal any 4 executive order by issuance of a new executive order. 5 The procedures set forth in this section shall be 6 (d) sufficient to make an executive order effective. 7 8 9 (e) Each executive order issued prior to the effective date of this act is void as of July 1, 2011, or 10 upon its repeal by a subsequent executive order, whichever 11 12 is earlier. 13 (f) As used in this section "executive order" means a 14 proclamation or order executed by the governor pursuant to 15 constitutional or statutory authority to implement any 16 17 provision of law; provided "executive order" does not include: 18

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20 (i) A proclamation issued by the governor
