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3	This chapter is known as the "Right to Keep and Bear Arms
4	in Private Vehicles Act."

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10	(i) "Firearm" means as defined by W.S

13	(ii) "Motor vehicle" means as defined by W.S.

14 motor vehicle or in a locked container attached to the

15 motor vehicle while the motor vehicle is not occupied; and

18 the outside of the motor vehicle.

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20 **27-15-104.** Protection from liability.

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22 A person that owns or controls a parking area that is

23 subject to this chapter and that complies with the

24 requirements of W.S. 27-15-103 is not liable in any civil

1	action	for	any	occurrence	resulting	from,	connected	with	or
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- 2 incidental to the use of a firearm, by any person, unless
- 3 the use of the firearm involves a criminal act by the
- 4 person who owns or controls the parking area.

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- 6 27-15-105. Cause of action for noncompliance;

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- 9 (a) An individual who is injured, physically or
- 10 otherwise, as a result of any policy or rule prohibited by
- 11 W.S. 27-15-103, may bring a civil action in a court of

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- 15 (b) Any individual who asserts a claim under this

2 circumstances are appropriate, punitive damages.

9 held to affect any rights or claims made in relation to

10 title 27, chapter 14, Wyoming Workers' Compensation Act.

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12 **27-15-106.** Exemptions.

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14 (a) School premises, including any school building or

15 school grounds in this state and other properties owned or

16 leased by a school, are exempt from the provisions of this

17 chapter.

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19 (b) Government entities, including a local authority

20 or state entity, are exempt from the provisions of this

21 chapter.

(c) Religious organizations, including religious 1

2 organizations acting as an employer, are exempt from the

provisions of this chapter. 3

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(d) Nothing in this act affects restrictions on the 5

carrying of concealed weapons as provided in W.S. 6
