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9 **Section 1.** W.S. 35-6-119 is created to read:

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- 13 (a) At least twenty-four (24) hours prior to an
- 14 abortion being performed, the physician or a qualified
- 15 person assisting the physician shall:

5	psychological risks of alternatives to abortion, including
6	the risks of pregnancy and childbirth;

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14	(v) Discuss birth control options to prevent
15	unintended pregnancy including availability, risks and
16	efficacy.
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18	(b) This section shall not apply to an abortion

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21	(i) To save the life or preserve the health of

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1 (ii) To save the life or preserve the health of 2 an unborn child; 3 (iii) To remove a nonviable fetus; 4 5 (iv) To remove an ectopic pregnancy; 6 7 (v) When the pregnancy is the result of: 8 9 10 Incest as defined by W.S. 6-4-402; or (A) 11 12 (B) Sexual assault as defined by W.S. 6-2-301 if the assault is reported to a law enforcement 13 14 agency within five (5) days after the assault or within five (5) days after the time the victim is capable of reporting 15 the assault. 16 17 18 (c) If disclosures are required pursuant subsection (a) of this section, the physician shall obtain 19 a signed statement from the pregnant woman acknowledging 20 provided the information specified 21 that she was subsection (a) of this section. The signed statement shall 22 be placed in the pregnant woman's medical file and shall be 23 24 treated as a confidential medical document under all applicable state and federal laws and regulations. 25
