1 2 (iv) Provides each school district opportunity 3 to implement a system of assessments within its capacity 4 for administering a high quality assessment; 5 (v) Provides accountability at the 6 student, teacher, school and state level. 7 8 9 (b) On or before November 1, 2011, the department shall submit the review required under subsection (a) of 10 11 this section, together with recommendations, in a report to the joint education interim committee on or before November 12 1, 2011. 13 14 (c) Following review of the report submitted under 15 subsection (b) of this section, the joint education interim 16 17 committee shall report recommendations, together with enabling legislation, in sufficient time for consideration 18 by the legislature in the 2012 budget session. 19 20
