HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. HJ0004

Repeal of 17th amendment.

A Bill

for

1 A JOINT RESOLUTION requesting Congress to propose an

2 amendment to the United States Constitution repealing the

3 seventeenth amendment to the United States Constitution.

4

5 WHEREAS, prior to the passage of the seventeenth amendment

6 of the United States Constitution, upon a vacancy in the

7 office of a senator, the governor of a state was empowered,

8 under Article 1, Section 3, Clause 2 of the United States

9 Constitution, to fill the vacancy with a temporary

10 appointment until such time as the legislature convened and

11 selected a replacement; and

12

13 WHEREAS, upon ratification of the seventeenth amendment of

14 the United States Constitution in 1913, the power to elect

15 senators from each state was passed to the people thereof;

WHEREAS, upon ratification of the seventeenth amendment of the United States Constitution in 1913, when a vacancy occurred in the office of a senator, the governor of the state was directed to issue a writ of election to fill the vacancy, provided, however, that the state legislature

7 could empower the governor to appoint a temporary successor

8 until the next election; and

9

WHEREAS, the founders of our republic and the framers of 10 republican 11 the constitution recognized that in а government, the legislative authority being necessarily 12 13 predominant, that it should be divided into two different branches composed by different modes of election, 14 creating different principles of action and as little 15 connected with each other as the nature of their common 16 17 functions and their common dependencies on society would admit; and 18

20 WHEREAS, James Madison, in the Federalist Papers, No. 10, 21 explained the reason for bicameralism: "Before taking 22 effect, legislation would have to be ratified by two 23 independent power sources: the people's representatives in

- 1 the House and the state legislatures' agents in the
- 2 Senate"; and

- 4 WHEREAS, James Madison, in the Federalist Papers, No. 62,
- 5 wrote that "The appointment of senators by state
- 6 legislatures gives the state governments such an agency in
- 7 the formation of the federal government as must secure the
- 8 authority of the former"; and

9

- 10 WHEREAS, Alexander Hamilton, in the Federalist Papers, No.
- 11 27, concluded that because the legislatures were selected
- 12 bodies of men, the choice of United States senators would
- 13 "generally be made with peculiar care and judgment by the
- 14 legislatures"; and

15

- 16 WHEREAS, the founders of the constitution created ar
- 17 ingenious template of checks and balances, with divisions
- 18 and distributions of power to provide for and protect the
- 19 highest sovereignty that of each individual citizen; and

20

- 21 WHEREAS, the seventeenth amendment of the United States
- 22 Constitution disrupts that balance of power by providing
- 23 for the selection of senators by popular vote in the same
- 24 manner representatives are selected by popular vote; and

2 WHEREAS, popular election of senators has diluted the power

3 of the separate states, diminished federalism and has

4 resulted in the increased power of the federal government

5 over the individual states.

7 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE

8 LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:

9

10 Section 1. That the Wyoming Legislature urges the

11 Wyoming Congressional delegation and all the members of the

12 United States Congress to propose an amendment to the

13 United States Constitution repealing the seventeenth

14 amendment thereof.

15

16 Section 2. That the Secretary of State of Wyoming

17 transmit copies of this resolution to the President of the

18 United States, to the President of the Senate and the

19 Speaker of the House of Representatives of the United

20 States Congress and to the Wyoming Congressional

21 Delegation.
