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13 21-3-110. Duties of boards of trustees.

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1 (a) The board of trustees in each school district 2 shall:

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4 (xviii) Establish a teacher performance

5 evaluation system and require the performance of each

2 (a) As used in the article: the following definitions

6 any teacher's contract of employment by the board of
7 trustees while such the contract is in effect; In the
8 case of a continuing contract teacher, dismissal shall mean
9 cancellation of his contract at any time other than at the
10 end of a school year where proper notice has been given;

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(vi) "Suspension with pay" means the removal of a teacher from the classroom during the school year without termination of salary: pending the outcome of a hearing in accordance with W.S. 21-7-110;

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17 (ix) "Suspension without pay" means the removal
18 of a teacher from the classroom during the school year with
19 the termination of salary for a period not to exceed one
20 (1) calendar year. commencing upon completion of a hearing
21 held under W.S. 21-7-110.

23 **21-7-105.** Employment of teachers on annual basis; 24 notice of termination to teachers.

2 An initial contract A teacher who has taught in the system 3 continuously for a period of at least ninety (90) days 4 shall be hired on an annual basis and shall be notified in 5 writing of the reasons for termination, if such is the case, no later than April 15 of each year. An initial 6 contract A teacher's employment may be terminated or 7 suspended with or without pay for any reason not 8 9 specifically prohibited by law., and a board is not limited 10 to the reasons set forth in W.S. 21 7 110(a). The notice of 11 termination shall not be disseminated to the public or to prospective employers absent the teacher's 12 Nothing contained in this section shall limit the use of 13 the notice in any hearing. Upon receipt of notice, the 14 teacher may request a hearing before an independent hearing 15 officer as provided under W.S. 21-7-110. 16

1 an independent hearing officer on the recommendation or the 2 reasons for dismissal or suspension, upon submission of a written request to the superintendent. The request for 3 4 hearing shall be given within seven (7) days after receipt 5 of notice under W.S. $\frac{21-7-106(a)}{21-7-105}$ or subsection (b) of this section. The independent hearing officer shall 6 possible, be impartial, experienced 7 insofar as education, labor and employment matters and in the conduct 8 9 of hearings. Within five (5) days following receipt of the hearing request, the superintendent and the teacher shall 10 11 jointly select a hearing officer. If they fail to agree upon selection, the district judge of the judicial district 12 13 in which the school district is located shall upon request select a hearing officer. Expenses of the hearing officer 14 shall be paid equally by the school district and the 15 16 teacher.

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(d) Within five (5) days after selection, the hearing officer shall set the date for hearing and notify the teacher and superintendent of the hearing date, time and location. In no event shall the hearing commence on a date later than forty-five (45) days after notice under W.S. 21 -7-106(a) 21-7-105 or subsection (b) of this section, as applicable. The hearing shall be conducted in accordance

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1 with the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act and the

2 hearing officer may accordingly receive or reject evidence

3 and testimony, administer oaths and if necessary, subpoena

4 witnesses. All school district records pertaining to the

5 teacher shall be made available to the hearing officer.

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(e) At the hearing, the teacher has the right to 7 appear in person with or without counsel, to be heard, to 8 9 present testimony or witnesses and all evidence bearing 10 upon proposed termination, dismissal or suspension and to 11 cross-examine witnesses. The superintendent shall have the burden of proving that the recommendation for termination 12 13 is based upon reasons provided in the notice of termination 14 submitted pursuant to W.S. $\frac{21}{7}, \frac{7}{106}$ $\frac{21}{6}, \frac{7}{105}$ or that suspension or dismissal termination is based upon reasons 15 specified in the notice given under subsection (b) of this 16 17 section, as applicable.

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19 **21-7-111.** Inapplicability of provisions.

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21 (a) Nothing in this article shall prohibit:

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23 (iv) The termination of the contract of a 24 teacher at the end of current school year because of a

- 1 decrease in the size of faculty due to decreased
- 2 enrollment, combining of school districts or an event
- 3 beyond the control of the board if notice of termination is
- 4 given pursuant to W.S. 21-7-105 and 21 7 106(a) except the
- 5 request for a hearing does not apply;

- 7 (b) Nothing in this article including the duty to
- 8 provide a reason for termination of an initial contract a
- 9 teacher's employment, shall be interpreted as requiring any
- 10 hearing or as requiring any proof of cause if school
- 11 districts are not prohibited from providing by policy or
- 12 contract, additional procedures or rights to initial
- 13 contract teachers.

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15 **21-7-112.** Effect on existing contracts.

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- 17 The contracts of all teachers in the state of Wyoming from
- 18 and after the effective date of this act May 1, 2011 shall
- 19 be subject to the policies, rules, and regulations of the
- 20 school district not in conflict with this law or the other
- 21 laws of the state of Wyoming.

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23 21-7-113. Application to teachers presently employed.

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1	The provisions of this article shall apply to all teachers
2	who are teaching in Wyoming on the effective date hereof;
3	provided, however, the status of teachers covered under
4	this act will be determined by their original date of
5	employment as a teacher in the state of Wyoming and after
6	May 1, 2011.
