A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to school districts; providing for the
- 2 enhanced teacher evaluation pilot program as specified;
- 3 requiring reports; providing an appropriation; and
- 4 providing for an effective date.

6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

7

8 Section 1.

9

- 10 (a) Two hundred ten thousand dollars (\$210,000.00) is
- 11 appropriated from the general fund to the department of
- 12 education to be expended for the teacher enhanced
- 13 evaluation pilot program established and authorized under
- 14 this section. This appropriation shall be for the period
- 15 beginning with the effective date of this act and ending
- 16 June 30, 2012.

2 (b) The enhanced teacher evaluation pilot program is 3 established under this section to implement an enhanced 4 evaluation process for all teachers in each school district 5 participating in the pilot program. 6 (c) The state superintendent of public instruction 7 shall select four (4) qualified school districts as 8 9 provided in subsection (d) of this section to participate 10 in the pilot program as follows: 11 (i) One (1) school district with an average 12 13 daily membership (ADM) of more than four thousand (4,000); 14 (ii) One (1) school district with an ADM of more 15 than one thousand (1,000) and four thousand (4,000) or 16 17 less; 18 One (1) school district with an ADM of 19 (iii) more than five hundred (500) and one thousand (1,000) or 20 21 less;

(iv) One (1) school district with an ADM of five 23 24 hundred (500) or less.

2 (d) In selecting school districts under subsection

3 (c) of this section, the state superintendent shall

4 determine if the school district is a qualified school

5 district. In order to be a qualified school district under

6 this subsection, the school district shall:

7

8 (i) Have an organized and active parent

9 organization with elected officers and which meets at least

10 once per month during the school year;

11

12 (ii) Submit a plan of action to the state

13 superintendent which shall include the following:

14

15 (A) A proposed schedule of teacher

16 evaluations to the state superintendent which at a minimum

17 would provide one (1) evaluation per semester for each

18 teacher in the district;

19

20 (B) A statement detailing the proposed

21 evaluation process which will be implemented by the

22 district. The evaluation process shall at a minimum comply

3

23 with the requirements of subsection (e) of this section;

24

1 (C) A statement detailing the method the

2 district will use to implement the results of evaluations

3 conducted under the pilot program including recommending

4 increases in pay for teachers with positive evaluations and

5 implementing termination proceedings if a teacher receives

6 three (3) consecutive failed evaluations.

7

8 (e) From the amount appropriated under subsection (a)

9 of this section, the state superintendent shall award

10 grants to the school districts selected under subsection

11 (c) of this section. The grants shall be expended by the

12 districts to implement an expanded teacher evaluation

13 process which includes:

14

15 (i) Using built-in classroom cameras to record

16 at least one (1) class period, unannounced per semester for

17 each teacher in the district;

18

19 (ii) Evaluation of each recorded class by the

20 school principal, the teacher who is being evaluated, an

21 instructional facilitator or a teacher with at least ten

22 (10) years of teaching experience and a parent of the

23 school's parent organization selected by the organization.

24 Each person evaluating a recorded class shall complete an

1 evaluation review form which will be reviewed by the

2 principal and the instructional facilitator or teacher with

3 ten (10) years of experience to determine recommendations

4 for improvement, set goals and timelines for improvement or

5 make recommendations for performance based pay increase;

6

7 (iii) A parent selected to participate in

8 evaluating a class shall attend the monthly meeting of the

9 parent organization. The parent group shall report to the

10 school board each month on the evaluations performed that

11 month and the evaluations scheduled for the upcoming month.

12

13 (f) Each district participating in the pilot program

14 under this section shall report to the state superintendent

15 not later than June 30, 2012 on the effectiveness of the

16 program. The report may include recommendations for

17 continuing or expanding the pilot program. The state

18 superintendent shall compile the reports submitted under

19 this subsection and report the results to the joint

20 education interim committee and the joint appropriations

5

21 interim committee not later than December 1, 2012.
