A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to health education by law enforcement;
- 2 creating an account; providing for the expenditure of funds
- 3 from the account for preventive education training by law
- 4 enforcement; providing an appropriation; providing
- 5 rulemaking authority; and providing for an effective date.

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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9 Section 1.

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- 11 (a) There is created the health education and law
- 12 enforcement prevention grant account which shall be funded
- 13 for the benefit of the department of health, mental heath
- 14 and substance abuse division.

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health education and law 1 (b) The enforcement 2 prevention grant account shall be funded through the 3 appropriation made in Section 2 of this act as well as any 4 received from federal grants and 5 contributions, grants, gifts, transfers, bequests and donations to the account. The account is specifically 6 empowered to accept grants, gifts, transfers, bequests and 7 donations including those which are limited in their 8 9 purposes by the grantor. (c) All monies in the health education and

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11 enforcement prevention grant account are continuously 12 13 appropriated to the department of health and shall be expended only to provide grants and other funding to law 14 enforcement agencies that provide prevention education 15 16 related to:

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Bullying, cyberbullying and internet safety; 18 (i)

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20 (ii) Prescription, over-the-counter and other 21 drug abuses and addictions;

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23 (iii) Decision making and positive, choices. 24

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2 (d) The department shall identify and select persons 3 to whom they will provide funding from the health education

4 and law enforcement prevention grant account based on the

5 following criteria:

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7 (i) Consideration of the number of people 8 served;

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10 (ii) The availability of other funding sources;

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12 (iii) The effectiveness of the services offered

13 in providing the prevention education identified in

14 subsection (c) of this section.

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16 (e) The department of health, mental health and

17 substance abuse division shall promulgate reasonable rules

18 and regulations in accordance with the Wyoming

19 Administrative Procedure Act to implement the award of

20 funds in the health education and law enforcement

21 prevention grant account and to review and monitor the

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22 expenditure of monies awarded.

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Section 2. There is appropriated one hundred thousand 1 2 (\$100,000.00) from the general dollars fund to the 3 department of health, mental heath and substance abuse division. This appropriation shall be for the period 4 beginning with the effective date of this act and ending 5 June 30, 2012. This appropriation shall be deposited in the 6 health education and law enforcement prevention grant 7 account, created by Section 1 of this act, and shall only 8 be expended for the purposes outlined in Section 1 of this 9 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this 10 11 appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any any unexpended, unobligated funds 12 other purpose and 13 remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30, 2012. This appropriation shall not be 14 included in the department of health's standard 2013-2014 15 16 budget.

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18 Section 3. The department of health, mental heath and 19 substance abuse division shall provide a report to the 20 joint labor, health and social services interim committee no 21 later than November 1, 2012 with respect to the expenditure of the appropriation provided by this act. The report shall 22 23 identify the persons or programs who received funds from the 24 health education and law enforcement prevention grant 25 account and the amounts received. The report also shall

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1 describe the types of education that were funded and

2 identify who received the education. The report shall

3 include any other information deemed relieving by the

4 department.

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6 Section 4. This act is effective immediately upon

7 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

8 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

9 Constitution.
