## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the guides and outfitters and the 2 Wyoming board of outfitters; providing definitions relating to guide and outfitting services; limiting terms of board 3 members; clarifying the board's authority to investigate 4 and issue citations; expanding the board's authority to 5 6 take disciplinary action against licensees; requiring complainants to cooperate with the board; specifying 7 additional requirements relating to guide and outfitting 8 services; providing for the loss of hunting privileges; and 9 providing for an effective date. 10

requiring dues or remuneration for providing personal
services in the field for the taking of any big or trophy
game animal;

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(B) "Landowner" means any person, firm or corporation holding title to, or occupying under a contract of purchase, agricultural land or any person whose family owns at least a majority of the stock in a Wyoming corporation and who provides services specified in this

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paragraph on lands owned by the corporation and used

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Appointed members shall be appointed by 6 (b) governor with the advice and consent of the senate in 7 accordance with W.S. 28-12-101 through 28-12-103 and may be 8 9 removed by the governor as provided by W.S. 9-1-202. more than four (4) members of the board shall be of the 10 11 same political party. Except as otherwise provided for initial appointees, the term of an appointed member shall 12 13 be three (3) years. After July 1, 2011, no appointed member shall serve more than two (2) consecutive terms on 14 15 the board.
