## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to administration of government; providing 2 a process for issuance of executive orders and
- 3 proclamations of the governor; specifying requirements for
- 4 executive orders and proclamations; providing for
- 5 termination of certain executive orders; and providing for
- 6 an effective date.

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8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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10 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-1-224 is created to read:

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9-1-224. Executive orders; requirements; effect.

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- 14 (a) Each executive order issued by the governor shall
- 15 be serially numbered for each calendar year and shall be
- 16 effective as provided in this section. An executive order

- 1 shall be effective only after signature by the governor,
- 2 countersignature by and filing with the secretary of state.
- 3 The secretary of state shall keep a permanent register and
- 4 file of executive orders.

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- 6 (b) An executive order shall state the constitutional
- 7 or statutory provision pursuant to which it is issued and
- 8 the specific constitutional or statutory provision which it
- 9 seeks to implement.

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- 11 (c) If an executive order fails to state the
- 12 constitutional or statutory provision pursuant to which it
- 13 is issued and the specific constitutional or statutory
- 14 provision which it seeks to implement, the order shall
- 15 cease to be effective on the fifteenth day following the
- 16 adjournment of the first regular legislative session
- 17 convened after the order was filed with the secretary of
- 18 state.

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- 20 (d) The procedures set forth in this section shall be
- 21 sufficient to make an executive order effective.

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- 23 (e) As used in this section "executive order" means a
- 24 proclamation or order executed by the governor pursuant to

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- 2 provision of law; provided "executive order" does not
- 3 include:

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- 5 (i) A proclamation issued by the governor
- 6 calling a special session of the legislature;

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- 8 (ii) A proclamation issued pursuant to chapter 4
- 9 of title 8 of the Wyoming statutes;

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- 11 (iii) Any proclamation calling for an election
- 12 or the convening of a state convention pursuant to W.S.
- 13 22-20-201;

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- 15 (iv) A proclamation of the adoption of a
- 16 constitutional amendment.

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- 18 **Section 2.** W.S. 9-1-302(a)(ii) and 9-1-303(a)(iii)
- 19 are amended to read:

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- 9-1-302. Powers and duties; custodian of public
- 22 records; preservation of proclamations of governor; removal
- 23 of public documents prohibited; exceptions.

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1 (a) The secretary of state is the custodian of, and 2 shall preserve:

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4 (ii) All proclamations of the governor 5 proclaiming the effectiveness of constitutional amendments, executive orders, corporate revocations and any other 6 proclamation designated as a permanent record by the 7 governor. The secretary of state shall preserve all other 8 9 proclamations of the governor for one (1) year and then 10 deliver them to the department of state parks and cultural resources for destruction or preservation as it deems 11

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desirable;

9-1-303. Powers and duties; affixing seal to and countersigning commissions and documents; certified copies of acts; file of commissions and appointments.

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18 (a) The secretary of state shall affix the great seal 19 of the state to, and countersign:

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21 (iii) Executive orders and proclamations of the
22 governor subject to W.S. 9-1-224 and other instruments when
23 required or authorized by the governor.

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3	(a) Any executive order in effect as of the effective					
4	date of this act shall be numbered and filed by the					
5	secretary of state in accordance with the provisions of this					
6	act. Unless reissued in accordance with the provisions of					
7	this act each such executive order shall cease to be					
8	effective on the earlier of:

10	(i) The date prescribed in the executive order;					
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12	(ii) Its repeal by a subsequent executive order;					
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14	(iii) The fifteenth day following the					
15	adjournment of the 2013 general and budget legislative					
16	session.					
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18	Section 4. This act is effective immediately upon					
19	completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law					
20	as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming					
21	Constitution.
