AN ACT relating to education; providing for a mandatory 1 waiver of student to teacher ratio for high performing 2 schools as defined by the Wyoming Education Accountability 3 4 Act; and providing for an effective date. 5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 6 7 8 Section 1. W.S. 21-13-307(a) (iv) is amended to read: 9 10 21-13-307. Eligibility to share in distribution of 11 money from foundation account; mandatory financial 12 reporting. 13 (a) Each district which following 14 meets the requirements is eligible to share in the distribution of 15

16 funds from the foundation account:

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2 The district shall provide evidence to the (iv) 3 state superintendent that the district has maintained an 4 average student-teacher ratio of not greater than sixteen 5 (16) to one (1) for the aggregate of all classes in kindergarten through grade three (3) in the district in the 6 preceding school year. The requirement of this paragraph 7 may be waived by the department of education for any 8 9 district that demonstrates insufficient school facility capacity, positive school performance, positive student 10 11 achievement or for other reasons related to the delivery of the education program to students. This paragraph shall 12 13 apply to charter schools established under W.S. not 14 21-3-301 through 21-3-314 or to the highest academically performing schools as defined by the Wyoming Accountability 15 in Education Act. The department shall compute the student-16 17 teacher ratio and report it to each district not later than March 1 of each year. To obtain a waiver under this 18 paragraph, a school district shall apply to the department 19 not later than March 15 of each year. The application 20 21 shall be based on the student-teacher ratio reported by the 22 department of education, together with any other information required by the department. The department 23 shall approve or deny an application for a waiver under 24

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this paragraph not later than April 10 of that year. A
waiver approved under this paragraph shall be effective for
the school year immediately following the application and
approval.
Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2012.
