- 7 two-thirds of all the members of the two houses, voting

- 10 Section 1. The following proposal to amend Wyoming
- 11 Constitution, Article 5, Section 5 is proposed for
- 12 submission to the electors of the State of Wyoming at the
- 13 next general election for approval or rejection to become
- 14 valid as a part of the Constitution if ratified by a
- 15 majority of the electors at the election:

Article 5, Section 5. Retirement and compensation of justices and judges.

3

Subject to the further provisions of this section, the 4 5 legislature shall provide for the voluntary retirement and compensation of justices and judges of the supreme court 6 and district courts, and may do so for any other courts, on 7 account of length of service, age and disability, and for 8 9 their reassignment to active duty where and when needed. 10 The office of every such justice and judge shall become 11 vacant when the incumbent reaches the age of seventy (70) years, as the legislature may prescribe; but, in the case 12 13 of an incumbent whose term of office includes the effective date of this amendment, this provision shall not prevent 14 15 him from serving the remainder of said term nor be applicable to him before his period or periods of judicial 16 17 service shall have reached a total of six (6) years. The legislature may also provide for benefits for dependents of 18 justices and judges. 19

21 **Section 2.** That the Secretary of State shall endorse 22 the following statement on the proposed amendment:
