- 1 AN ACT relating to oil and gas; modifying surety provisions
- 2 for seismic activities; modifying rule requirements;
- 3 conforming provisions; and providing for an effective date.

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5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 7 **Section 1.** W.S. 30-5-104(d)(v)(A) and 30-5-404(b) and
- 8 (c) are amended to read:

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- 10 30-5-104. Oil and gas conservation commission; powers
- 11 and duties; investigations; rules and regulations.

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13 (d) The commission has authority:

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15 (v) To adopt rules and regulations to:

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1	(A) Regulate the plugging, sealing or
2	capping of seismic shot holes, and to require, and fix the
3	amount of, a surety bond or other guaranty to ensure
4	compliance with regulations governing all geophysical
5	operations and to ensure compliance with W.S. 30-5-401
6	through 30-5-410. When oil and gas operations as defined in
7	W.S. 30-5-401(a)(iv) involve seismic activities, the rules
8	shall require a surety or other guaranty which is
9	sufficient to protect the interests of the surface owners
10	affected by the activities and which, in all events, shall
11	be in an amount of not less than five thousand dollars
12	(\$5,000.00) for the first one thousand (1,000) acres or
13	portion thereof per surface owner for which access is
14	sought for seismic activities and not less than one
15	thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for each additional one
16	thousand (1,000) acres or portion thereof per surface owner
17	for which access is sought for seismic activities;
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19	30-5-404. Surety bond or guaranty; approval;
20	objections; release of surety bond or guaranty.

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(b) The surety bond or other guaranty shall be in an amount of not less than two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) per well site on the land unless the operations involve

seismic activities. If the operations involve seismic 1 activities, the surety bond shall be as provided in W.S. 2 3 30-5-104(d)(v)(A) and shall only be accepted from and posted by the oil and gas operator who has a valid lease or 4 5 posted by a person who is an agent of, under contract with, or is the assignee of the lessee of a valid lease. No 6 7 person shall be authorized to conduct operations involving seismic activities who is not an operator with a valid 8 9 lease or a person who is an agent of, under contract with, or the assignee of the lessee of a valid lease. At the 10 11 request of the oil and gas operator, after attempted consultation with the surface owner the commission may 12 13 establish a blanket bond or other guaranty in an amount covering oil and gas operations on the surface owner's land 14 as identified by an oil and gas operator in the written 15 notice required under W.S. 30-5-402(e). 16 Neither the 17 minimum amount of the per well site bond or other guaranty specified or referenced in this subsection nor a blanket 18 bond or other guaranty established by the commission is 19 20 intended to establish any amount for reasonable 21 foreseeable damages.

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23 (c) Within seven (7) days following receipt of a per 24 well site surety bond or other quaranty or the

1 establishment of a blanket bond or other guaranty specified or referenced in this section, the commission shall notify 2 the surface owner of receipt of the per well site surety 3 bond or other guaranty or the establishment of a blanket 4 5 bond or other quaranty based on the oil and gas operator's written notice required 6 request and the under The commission's notice shall also include a 7 30-5-402(e). description of the amount and the type of the bond or 8 9 guaranty received or established and provide to the surface 10 a copy of the statement required under 11 30-5-403(a). If, at the expiration of thirty (30) days after receipt of the commission's notice by the surface 12 13 owner, he makes no objection to the amount or the type of 14 the surety bond or quaranty, the commission shall approve the surety bond or guaranty. If the surface owner objects 15 in writing to the amount or the type of the surety bond or 16 17 guaranty, the commission shall give immediate consideration to the surety bond or quaranty objected to and the 18 19 accompanying papers filed by the oil and gas operator in 20 support of the surety bond or guaranty amount and the type 21 of surety bond or guaranty submitted or established, and 22 the surface owner's objections, and the commission shall render a final decision as to the acceptability of the 23 24 amount and type of the surety bond or quaranty and shall

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notify the parties of the decision. Proof of any additional surety bond or guaranty required by the commission shall be filed with the commission within thirty (30) days of the commission's final decision. Any aggrieved party may appeal the final decision of the commission to the district court in accordance with the
