8 **Section 1.** W.S. 6-8-105 is created to read:

- 10 6-8-105. Special exceptions for state issued
- 11 concealed carry permits.

- 13 (a) Persons holding a valid concealed carry permit
- 14 issued by the state of Wyoming under W.S. 6-8-104(a)(ii)
- 15 may carry a firearm in the following places:

2 (i) Any school, college or professional athletic 3 event conducted on public property;

5 (ii) Any public college or university facility.

7 (b) Permanent employees of a school district who hold 8 a valid concealed carry permit issued by the state of

9 Wyoming under W.S. 6-8-104(a)(ii) may carry a concealed

10 firearm on or into any facility of the school district,

11 provided the employee first notifies the following persons

12 that the employee intends to carry a concealed firearm on

13 or into a school district facility:

14

15 (i) The superintendent of the school district;

16 and

17

(ii) The principal of the school at which the employee is employed, or other person with responsibility for the school district facility at which the employee is employed.

23 (c) The superintendent of the school district shall 24 inform all law enforcement agencies with jurisdiction over

1 the area in which the school district facility is located

2 of all permanent employees providing notice pursuant to

3 subsection (b) of this section. Information provided under

4 this subsection shall only be used by local law enforcement

5 in preparing for a response to any potential incident at a

6 school district facility.

8 (d) In addition to those persons specified in

9 subsection (b) of this section, persons who hold a valid

10 concealed carry permit issued by the state of Wyoming under

11 W.S. 6-8-104(a)(ii) may carry a concealed firearm on or

12 into a school or facility of the school district, provided:

14 (i) The person is the parent or legal quardian

15 of a student currently enrolled in the school or school

16 district facility;

18 (ii) Upon entering the school or school district

19 facility, the person notifies the principal of the school

20 or other person with responsibility for the school district
