Game and fish license fees-2.

A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to game and fish; amending hunting,
- 2 fishing, watercraft and other license and application fees
- 3 as specified; eliminating resident daily game bird/small
- 4 game licenses; providing for separate bull and cow/calf
- 5 wild bison licenses; providing for the adjustment of
- 6 license, application, entry, stamp and permit fees
- 7 annually; requiring reports; authorizing rulemaking; and
- 8 providing for an effective date.

10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

11

12 **Section 1.** W.S. 23-1-505 is created to read:

13

14 23-1-505. Annual fee adjustments.

15

1 (a) As provided in W.S. 23-1-702, 23-2-101(e), (f),

2 (j) and (k), 23-2-107(c)(ii) and (e), 23-2-201(d),

3 23-2-301(c), 23-2-306(a) and (b), 23-2-307(b), 41-13-104(f)

4 and 41-13-109(a), the changes in the implicit price

5 deflator for state and local government purchases of goods

6 and services, as published by the United States department

7 of commerce, shall be used by the commission as the index

8 to determine an annual rate of increase or decrease in the

9 application fees, entry fees and fees for licenses, stamps,

10 permits and tags issued by the department.

11

The commission shall determine the change in the 12 (b) 13 implicit price deflator for state and local government purchases of goods and services, as published by the United 14 States department of commerce, for the quarter ending March 15 31 of the current year compared to the quarter ending March 16 17 31 of the previous year. The relative amount of the change may be multiplied by the current application fee or entry 18 fee and for each current license, stamp, permit and tag 19 20 issued by the department. The product may be rounded to 21 the nearest even dollar amount and the resulting amount may 22 be added to the fee for the current year. If adopted by rule and regulation the resulting amount may be the fee for 23 the license year beginning in the next succeeding calendar 24

1 year for the application fee and license, stamp, permit and

2 tag issued by the department that is adjusted under this

3 section.

5 (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the

6 commission may recalculate the current fees charged for

7 each application fee, entry fee and license, stamp, permit

8 and tag issued by the department to determine that all

9 appropriate indexing has been included in the current fees.

10

11 (d) The calculations provided for in this section

12 shall be reported to the legislature and the governor in

13 the annual report provided in W.S. 23-1-503.

14

15 (e) The commission shall, at least every six (6)

16 years, analyze all application fees and fees for licenses,

17 stamps, permits and tags issued by the department to ensure

18 the appropriate fee is charged. Where appropriate, the

19 commission shall recommend to the legislature that fees

20 established by statute be adjusted to ensure that those

21 fees are appropriate.

23 (f) In accordance with W.S. 16-3-104(b)(i), rules

24 promulgated by the commission to adjust fees as provided in

- 1 this section shall not become effective until after the
- 2 legislature has convened and adjourned the regular general
- 3 or budget session next succeeding the adoption of the rules
- 4 by the commission.

19 (a) The commission is directed and empowered:

- 22 application fees, entry fees and fees for licenses, stamps,
- 23 permits and tags issued by the department annually to an
- 24 amount computed in accordance with W.S. 23-1-505.

2 23-1-702. Duplicate license upon loss or destruction of original; issuance; fees. 3

5 When any license issued under this act has been lost or destroyed, the licensee may secure a duplicate of the 6 original license from any district office or any authorized 7 personnel of the department upon the presentation of 8 9 satisfactory proof that the original license was lost or 10 destroyed. Prior to issuing the duplicate license and in 11 accordance with rule and regulation of the commission, the department may assess a fee of not more than three dollars 12 13 (\$3.00) three dollars and seventy-five cents (\$3.75) as 14 adjusted pursuant to W.S. 23-1-505, plus the fee charged under W.S. 23-1-701. Duplicate licenses shall be issued in 15 accordance with procedure established by commission order. 16

17

23-2-101. Fees; restrictions; nonresident application 18 nonresident licenses; verification of residency 19 fee; 20 required.

21

22 (d) The commission may issue big or trophy game all licenses 23 licenses in areas in which 24 authorized were not purchased or in which additional

1 harvest is desired, allowing a licensee to take a big or

2 trophy game animal of such sex or age as designated by the

3 commission. The fee for the license may be reduced by the

4 commission to the level necessary to achieve the desired

5 management objectives, but in no case shall a resident or

6 nonresident license fee, excluding resident and nonresident

7 youth license fees, be less than the landowner's coupon

8 fee.

9

Resident and nonresident license applicants shall 10 pay an application fee in an amount specified by this 11 subsection upon submission of an application for purchase 12 13 of any limited quota drawing for big or trophy game license or wild bison license. The resident application fee shall 14 be five dollars (\$5.00) six dollars (\$6.00) and the 15 nonresident application fee shall be fourteen dollars 16 17 (\$14.00) seventeen dollars (\$17.00) as adjusted pursuant to The application fee is in addition to the 18 W.S. 23-1-505. fees prescribed by subsections (f) and (j) of this section 19 20 and by W.S. 23-2-107 and shall be payable to the department 21 either directly or through an authorized selling agent of the department. At the beginning of each month, the 22 commission shall set aside all of the fees collected during 23 calendar year 1980 and not to exceed twenty-five percent 24

1 (25%) of the fees collected thereafter pursuant to this

2 subsection to establish and maintain a working balance of

3 five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00), to compensate

4 owners or lessees of property damaged by game animals and

5 game birds.

6

Forty percent (40%) of available nonresident elk 7 licenses, forty percent (40%) of available nonresident deer 8 9 licenses and forty percent (40%) of available nonresident antelope licenses for any one (1) calendar year shall as 10 11 established by the commission, be offered to nonresident applicants upon receipt of the fee prescribed by this 12 Seventy-five (75) of the nonresident deer 13 subsection. licenses set aside pursuant to this subsection shall be 14 used for a national bow hunt for deer. The licenses 15 authorized by this subsection shall be offered by drawing 16 17 to nonresident applicants prior to the drawing for the remaining nonresident licenses issued. 18 The licenses offered under this subsection shall be issued in a manner 19 prescribed by rules and regulations promulgated by the 20 21 commission. Nothing in this subsection shall prohibit any 22 unsuccessful applicant for a nonresident license pursuant to this subsection from submitting an application for any 23 24 licenses remaining after the drawing during the calendar

year in which the application under this subsection was 1 2 submitted. The following fees as adjusted pursuant to W.S. 3 23-1-505 shall be collected by the department and are in addition to the nonresident license fee for the appropriate 4 5 big game species imposed under subsection (j) of this section and the application fee imposed under subsection 6 (e) of this section: 7 8 9 (i) Nonresident elk license \$480.00 \$600.00 in addition to the license fee imposed under 10 11 paragraph (j)(xix) of this section; 12 13 (ii) Nonresident deer license \$300.00 in addition to the license fee 14 imposed under paragraph (j)(xv) of this section; 15 16 17 (iii) Nonresident antelope license \$240.00 \$300.00 in addition to the license fee 18 imposed under paragraph (j)(xxxi) of this section. 19 20 21 (j) Subject to W.S. 23-2-101(f), 23-1-705(e) and the 22 applicable fee under W.S. 23-1-701, the following hunting licenses and tags may be purchased for the fee indicated as 23

10 (\$6.00) seven dollars (\$7.00) as adjusted pursuant to W.S.
11 23-1-505;

13 (e) A resident applicant shall pay a license fee of four hundred dollars (\$400.00) four hundred eighty dollars 14 (\$480.00) as adjusted pursuant to W.S. 23-1-505 for a bull 15 license or two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) as adjusted 16 pursuant to W.S. 23-1-505 for a cow/calf license and shall 17 pay the fee required by W.S. 23-2-101(e). A nonresident 18 applicant shall pay a license fee of two thousand five 19 20 hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) three thousand dollars 21 (\$3,000.00) as adjusted pursuant to W.S. 23-1-505 for a 22 bull license or one thousand five hundred dollars 23 (\$1,500.00) as adjusted pursuant to W.S. 23-1-505 for a cow/calf license and shall pay the fee required by W.S. 24
