37-9-1401. Railroad security officers; authority; use 15

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2 Any railroad company operating a railroad in this 3 state and incorporated pursuant to the laws of this state, 4 or of the United States, or of any state or territory of 5 the United States, may hire a person who meets the minimum background and training requirements for a peace officer 6 specified in W.S. 9-1-701 through 9-1-707, as a railroad 7 security officer. A railroad security officer shall have 8 9 the authority to enforce the laws of the state of Wyoming for the protection of: 10 11 (i) 12 The railroad's employees, passengers 13 patrons; 14 15 (ii) railroad's The property or property entrusted to the railroad for transportation purposes; 16 17 (iii) The movement of cargo in the railroad's 18 possession or in the possession of another railroad or 19 20 nonrail carrier while on railroad property; and 21

1 (b) A railroad security officer is authorized to use

2 only such nondeadly force as the circumstances require in

3 the following situations:

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5 (i) To prevent the commission of a crime related

6 to the protections which the officer is empowered to

7 provide under subsection (a) of this section;

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9 (ii) To defend himself or others against

10 physical assault; and

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12 (iii) To prevent serious damage to property.

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14 (c) A railroad security officer shall have the right

15 to use a firearm or otherwise employ deadly force only as a

16 last resort when reasonably necessary to prevent the

17 commission of a violent felony as defined in W.S.

18 6-1-104(a)(xii) or to defend himself or any other person

19 from imminent danger of death or serious bodily injury.

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21 (d) Within three (3) days following any incident

22 involving the use of force by a railroad security officer,

23 the railroad security officer shall file a written report

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1 describing the incident at the office of the county sheriff

2 in each county in which the incident occurred.

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(e) The powers and authority granted by this section 4 5 shall apply only to a railroad security officer acting within the scope of his duties on railroad property. A 6 railroad security officer, however, shall have the same 7 authority off railroad property that applies to him on 8 9 railroad property when he is in fresh pursuit of a person 10 whom the officer has probable cause to believe 11 committed a violation of Wyoming law related to the protections which the officer is empowered to provide under 12

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15 (f) A railroad security officer shall not be
16 considered a peace officer or law enforcement officer under
17 the statutes of this state.

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19 (g) Neither the sovereign immunity of the state nor 20 the immunity applicable to any local government shall 21 extend to a railroad security officer. Neither the 22 railroad security officer nor the employing railroad 23 company may plead the defense of sovereign immunity in any

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1 action arising out of the railroad security officer's

2 conduct.

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4 (h) As used in this section, "railroad property"

5 shall mean rights-of-way, easements, appurtenant property,

6 equipment, cargo, facilities, buildings and other

7 structures owned, leased, operated, maintained or

8 transported by a railroad company.
