(c) A person other than a minor dependent qualifying 1 under subsection (b) of this section or a full-time student 2 3 qualifying under subsection (k) of this section, shall lose his residency in Wyoming if he moves to another state, 4 5 territory or country and makes it his domicile, or makes any claim of residency for any purpose to that state, 6 territory or country. Provided he does not claim residency 7 in any other state, territory or country for any purpose, a 8 9 person shall not gain or lose residency in Wyoming merely by reason of his presence in or absence from the state 10 11 while:

13 (d) A person shall lose his residency in Wyoming if he resides in any other state, territory or country for an 14 aggregate of one hundred eighty (180) days or more in a 15 calendar year, unless he qualifies as a resident under 16 17 subsection (b), (c), (e), or (k) of this section. A person who resides in any other state, territory or country 18 other than Wyoming, for less than an aggregate of one 19 hundred eighty (180) days in a calendar year, may maintain 20 21 residency in Wyoming under this act only if he qualifies as a resident under subsection (b), (c), (e),  $\frac{or}{or}$  (f)  $\frac{or}{or}$  (k) of 22 this section or if: 23

(h) An applicant shall provide proof of residency and swear to an oath of residency when making application for, or attempting to purchase, a resident license, preference point, permit or tag under this act. License selling agents and the department shall consider as documentary evidence of residency any of the following:

(iii) A proof of residency statement on a form 8 9 provided by the department that has been completed and 10 signed by the applicant. Any full-time student qualifying 11 under subsection (k) of this section and active duty member of the armed forces, his spouse or minor dependent of the 12 13 active duty member making application for or purchasing a resident license, preference point, permit or tag shall be 14 required to complete and submit the proof of residency 15 16 statement; or

(k) Any student who lives in Wyoming for ninety (90)

days and is enrolled as a full-time student at the

University of Wyoming, a Wyoming community college or any

school licensed in this state offering postsecondary

education shall qualify as a resident under this section so

long as the student remains a full-time student. For

defined in W.S. 31-1-101(a)(xxxi).
