- 1 AN ACT relating to the federal Real ID Act; amending
- 2 Wyoming's motor vehicle statutes to remove provisions added
- 3 in 2009 to comply with the federal Real ID Act; prohibiting
- 4 the retention of documents as specified; requiring the
- 5 destruction of specified documents; prohibiting late
- 6 renewal penalties as specified; prohibiting nonoptical
- 7 identification of driver's licenses; and providing for an
- 8 effective date.

10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 12 **Section 1.** W.S. 7-19-106(a)(xvi), 8-7-101,
- 31-7-111(a), 31-7-113(f)(i), 31-7-115(a)(iii)(C), (D) and
- 14 by creating a new subsection (c), 31-7-119(a) and by
- 15 creating new subsections (j) and (k), 31-7-120 by creating

1 a new subsection (e), 31-8-101, 31-8-102(a)(vi) through 2 (viii) and 31-8-103(a) and (c)(ii) are amended to read: 3 4 7-19-106. identification card issued under W.S. 31-8-101 may be used.

1 31-7-111. Application for license or permit 2 generally.

(a) Every application for instruction 4 5 driver's license, commercial driver's license or commercial driver instruction permit shall be made upon a form 6 furnished by the division. Every application shall be 7 accompanied by the proper fee, proof of residence, and 8 proof of identity. Proof of identity shall be established 9 10 by a certified copy of the applicant's birth certificate, valid unexpired United States passport, consular report of 11 birth abroad, certificate of citizenship, certificate of 12 naturalization, permanent resident card, employment 13 authorization document, foreign passport (with United 14 States visa affixed and accompanied by an approved document 15 documenting the applicant's most recent admittance to the 16 United States), state issued driver's license or 17 identification card which complies with federal law and 18 applicable regulations, or other document required by the 19 division to establish identity where reasons beyond the 20 21 applicant's control prevent the applicant from presenting 22 the documents required by this subsection and if the applicant has not previously been licensed in this state or 23 another jurisdiction, by a certified copy of the 24

1 applicant's birth certificate or a valid unexpired United 2 States passport. 3 31-7-113. Fees. 4 5 Notwithstanding W.S. 31-7-115(b), any licensee on 6 (f) active duty in the armed forces of the United States who is 7 stationed outside the state of Wyoming, or his spouse or 8 9 dependent child who has a valid driver's license issued 10 under this chapter, may obtain a license with an updated 11 photograph and the same expiration date of the current license without payment of any fee, unless renewing under 12 13 W.S. 31-7-119, if: 14 15 (i) While outside the state, the person surrenders the current license and submits an updated color 16 17 photograph certified by military officials to be photograph of the person; or 18 19 20 31-7-115. Issuance, description and contents. 21 22 (a) Upon the satisfactory completion of any required examination, the division shall issue to every qualifying 23 24 applicant a driver's license, and:

6	numbers or letters deemed appropriate, date of birth,
7	principal residence mailing address, height, weight and sex

10	required on a driver's license;

13	of the licensee;

15	(c) No license issued under this section shall
16	include any marking or contain any device which allows the
17	license to be identified other than by optical means.

19	31-7-119. Expiration and renewal; required tests;

22	(a) Every driver's license shall expire on the
23	licensee's birthday in the fourth year following the

24 issuance of the license. <u>Every driver's license is</u>

- 1 renewable within one hundred twenty (120) days before its
- 2 expiration upon application, payment of the required fee
- 3 and satisfactory completion of the examination required or
- 4 authorized by subsection (b) of this section. The division
- 5 may renew a driver's license more than one hundred twenty
- 6 (120) days before its expiration if the applicant states in
- 7 writing that he will not be in the state during the one
- 8 hundred twenty (120) days before the license expires.

- 10 (j) The license extension shall be properly affixed
- 11 to the reverse side of the license to validate extension.

12

- 13 (k) No adverse action, including the expiration of a
- 14 driver's license or an increased fee, shall be imposed on
- 15 any person who fails to timely renew a driver's license due
- 16 to the person's inability to provide the documentation that
- 17 was required by W.S. 31-7-111(a) prior to July 1, 2013, as
- 18 indicated in a statement signed by the person.

- 23 electronic or other copy of any document presented to the
- 24 division to prove identity under W.S. 31-7-111(a). Any

It shall have: 3 (vi) The registrant's full facial digital color 4 5 photograph; 6 (vii) The following: "State of Wyoming" -7 "Identification Card No." - "This card is provided 8 9 solely for the purpose of identification of the person described on the card"; and 10 11 12 (viii) As provided for in W.S. 31-7-139.; and 13 31-8-103. Expiration; records; new cards. 14 15 (a) Identification cards shall not expire. on the 16 registrant's birthday in the eighth year following issuance 17 of the identification card. The department shall keep 18 records of data contained in identification cards. 19 20 21 (c) If any information contained in the 22 identification card becomes inaccurate, or if it is desired

to withdraw or insert notice of anatomical organ donation,

18 comply with the federal Real ID Act and shall promulgate

19 new rules which are similar in scope and operation to those

20 which existed prior to efforts to comply with the federal

21 Real ID Act.

24 department of transportation shall have the authority to

1 adopt, amend and repeal rules and regulations to comply

2 with the requirements of this act.
