ARTICLE 4 15

16 NEGLECTED AND ABANDONED ANIMALS GRANT PROGRAM

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1	11-31-401. Neglected and abandoned animals grant
2	program; administration.
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4	There is created the neglected and abandoned animals grant
5	program to assist communities in providing care for
6	neglected or abandoned cats and dogs. Grants under the
7	program shall be awarded by the neglected and abandoned
8	animals board created pursuant to W.S. 11-31-402. The
9	program shall be administered by the department.
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11	11-31-402. Wyoming neglected and abandoned animal
12	board; creation; members.
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14	(a) There is created the Wyoming neglected and
15	abandoned animals board. The board shall consist of five
16	(5) members, as follows:
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18	(i) The director of the department or his
19	designee; and
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21	(ii) Four (4) persons appointed by the governor,

(A) Two (2) licensed veterinarians; and

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5 (b) Except for the director of the department of

6 agriculture who shall serve continuously, members of the

7 board shall serve terms of three (3) years. The initial

8 board shall have staggered terms of one (1) member for one

9 (1) year, two (2) members for two (2) years and one (1)

10 member for three (3) years, as determined by the governor.

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- 12 (c) Board members shall be reimbursed for per diem,
- 13 mileage and expenses for attending meetings in the same
- 14 manner and amount as state employees.

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19 (a) In awarding grants under the program, the board

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22 (i) Determine the best allocation of grant funds

23 based on the applications submitted and the funds

24 available;

2 (ii) Determine whether to award a grant to an 3 applicant based on:

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5 (A) The ability of the applicant to use the

6 requested funds to care for neglected and abandoned dogs

7 and cats;

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9 (B) Whether the community applying for the

10 grant is currently served by an animal control entity;

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12 (C) The unmet need in the community for the

13 care of neglected and abandoned dogs and cats.

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15 (b) The board may accept federal grants and other

16 contributions, grants, gifts, transfers, bequests and

17 donations. The board, through the department, may apply

18 for any available grants for the care of neglected and

19 abandoned animals.

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21 (c) In administering the program the department

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22 shall:

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1	(i) In consultation with the board, promulgate
2	reasonable rules and regulations necessary to carry out the
3	purposes of this act including rules relating to:
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5	(A) Grant application procedures;
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7	(B) Grant eligibility; and
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9	(C) Criteria for evaluation, ranking and
10	prioritization of grant applications;
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12	(D) Appropriate expenditure of grant funds
13	for the care of neglected and abandoned animals, including:
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15	(I) Providing shelter and food;
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17	(II) Providing medical care for
18	neglected and abandoned animals, including spaying or
19	neutering and euthanasia when appropriate;

Grant eligibility; distribution of funds. 1 2 To qualify for a grant under this act, 3 (a) 4 applicant shall: 5 6 (i) Be a board of county commissioners or the governing body of a municipality; 7 8 9 (ii) Have an unmet or unfunded need to care for neglected or abandoned animals within the boundaries of the 10 11 political subdivision over which the applicant has authority; 12 13 Submit a grant application pursuant to 14 (iii) rules promulgated under this article. 15 16 17 (b) Grant funds shall only be distributed to entity under the complete control of the state of Wyoming 18 or a nonprofit entity who provides care for neglected and 19 20 abandoned animals in the political subdivision of 21 applicant. 22 11-31-405. Neglected and abandoned animals account; 23

disbursements from the account.

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2 There is created the neglected and abandoned animals 3 account. The account shall consist of those appropriated to the account by the legislature and all 4 5 monies received from federal grants and other contributions, grants, gifts, transfers, bequests 6 donations to the trust account. The account is specifically 7 empowered to accept grants, gifts, transfers, bequests and 8 9 donations. Funds shall only be withdrawn from the account for grants authorized by the neglected and abandoned 10

animals board as provided in this article.

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Section 2.

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is appropriated one hundred thousand 15 There (a) dollars (\$100,000.00) from the general fund to 16 the 17 neglected and abandoned animals account created by this This appropriation shall only be expended to provide 18 grants pursuant to this act. Notwithstanding any other 19 provision of law, any unexpended funds appropriated under 20 21 this section shall not revert until further act of the 22 legislature to revert the funds.

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(b) There is appropriated seventy-five thousand 1 2 dollars (\$75,000.00) from the general fund to the department of agriculture to fulfill the purposes of this 3 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this 4 5 appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any any unexpended, unobligated funds 6 other purpose and 7 remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30, 2014. 8

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Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2013. 10
