Remediation for Hathaway recipients.

## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to the Hathaway student scholarship
- 2 program; establishing a reporting system for honor Hathaway
- 3 recipients receiving postsecondary remedial education;
- 4 requiring payment of tuition costs by school districts;
- 5 authorizing loans as specified; and providing for an
- 6 effective date.

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8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 10 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-13-313 by creating a new
- 11 subsection (h), 21-16-1301(a) by creating a new paragraph
- 12 (xx) and 21-16-1308 by creating a new subsection (f) are
- 13 amended to read:

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1 21-13-313. Distribution of funds from foundation

2 account; property tax and cash reserve adjustment;

3 regulations; district remediation payments.

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5 (h) For any district subject to W.S. 21-16-1308(f) whose remediation tuition costs at the University of 6 7 Wyoming and Wyoming community colleges for resident high school graduates receiving the honor scholarship under W.S. 8 9 21-16-1301 through 21-16-1310 for any academic year exceed one-tenth of one percent (.10%) of its foundation program 10 amount determined under W.S. 21-13-309(p) for that school 11 year, and upon demonstration by the district of financial 12 need as documented by cash flow analysis, the state 13 14 superintendent shall provide a payment to the district from the foundation program account in an amount not to exceed 15 the amount of tuition costs exceeding one-tenth of one 16 17 percent (.10%) of the district's foundation program amount for that school year. Payments to a district under this 18 19 subsection shall be in addition to amounts paid under subsections (b) and (c) of this section and made in the 20 21 school year immediately following the school year in which 22 paid, shall be withheld from the district's foundation program amount computed under W.S. 21-13-309(p) or if the 23

1 district is subject to W.S. 21-13-102(b), added to the 2 amount of funds to be recaptured. 3 4 21-16-1301. Definitions. 5 (a) As used in this article: 6 7 "Remedial education course" means a course 8 (xx)9 offered by an institution for which successful completion does not count as credit towards a degree or certificate 10 awarded by that institution, and is offered to students 11 lacking skills necessary to perform at the level required 12 13 for that course by the institution. 14 15 21-16-1308. Administration; rules and regulations; remedial education payments. 16 17 (f) For each academic semester, the University of 18 19 Wyoming and each Wyoming community college shall maintain a 20 list of students receiving the honor scholarship under this 21 article who are enrolled in a remedial education course at 22 the institution. For each reported student receiving the 23 honor scholarship enrolling in a remedial education course, the reporting institution shall identify the Wyoming school 24

1 district from which the student graduated from high school. Within forty-five (45) days after each academic semester 2 3 commences, the university and each college shall report to 4 each applicable school district the number of students 5 receiving the honor scholarship under this article who graduated from a high school within that district and are 6 7 enrolled in remedial education courses during that academic term at that institution. The institution shall also 8 9 report to the district the total costs of tuition for providing remedial instruction to all reported students 10 from that district. Upon verification of reported numbers 11 of resident students enrolled in remedial education courses 12 13 during any academic term, the school district of residence shall pay the remedial instruction tuition costs associated 14 15 with resident students to the appropriate institution. Payment by each applicable school district under this 16 17 subsection shall be made to each reporting institution not later than seventy-five (75) days after the institution's 18 academic term has commenced. If any payment differs from 19 the amount actually due an institution, the excess or 20 21 deficient amount shall be deducted from or added to the 22 next payment made under this subsection. For purposes of this subsection, payments due for any summer term shall be 23 24 included within the computations and payments for

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subsequent fall academic term. The university or any 1 2 community college reporting and receiving payment under this subsection shall not directly assess and collect any 3 4 remedial instruction tuition from a reported resident 5 student enrolled in a remedial education program at that 6 institution. 7 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2013. 8 9
