6	(a) Notwithstanding W.S. 39-11-109(c)(ii) through (viii) refunds
7	provided by W.S. 39-11-109(c)(ii) through (viii) for fiscal year 2014 shall
8	be reduced based upon the available legislative appropriation for the
9	program in accordance with the following:
10	
11	(i) The department of revenue shall multiply the amount
12	authorized under W.S. 39-11-109(c)(ii) through (viii) by a fraction, the
13	numerator of which is equal to the remaining legislative appropriation for
14	the program for the 2013-2014 fiscal biennium, and the denominator of which
15	is equal to the total refunds to qualifying recipients under W.S.
16	39-11-109(c)(ii) through (viii) for fiscal year 2014; and
17	
18	(ii) In no event shall the refund be greater than the amounts
19	authorized under W.S. 39-11-109(c)(ii) through (viii).
