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5 (a) Α limited wine and malt beverage permit authorizing the sale of wine and malt beverages only may be 6 the appropriate licensing authority to any 7 issued by responsible person or organization for sales at a picnic, 8 9 bazaar, fair, rodeo, special holiday or similar public 10 gathering. No person or organization holding the special 11 permit shall sell any alcoholic liquor other than wine and malt beverages on the premises described on the permit, nor 12 13 shall any wine or malt beverage be sold or consumed off the premises authorized by the permit. 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17 The permits authorized by this section shall be issued for one (1) twenty-four (24) hour period, subject to 18 the schedule of operating hours provided by W.S. 12-5-101. 19 20 No person or organization shall receive more than a total 21 of twelve (12) limited wine and malt beverage and twenty-22 four (24) catering permits for sales at the same premises in any one (1) year, except that this limitation shall not 23 24 be applicable to limited wine and malt beverage permits

Any applicant applying for a permit 12 13 authorized by this section and having licensed premises located within a jurisdiction other than that jurisdiction 14 to which application is made, shall secure the written 15 approval of the licensing authority of that jurisdiction in 16 17 which the licensed premises are located prior to filing an application for a permit. 18

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The fee for the limited wine and malt beverage 20 21 permit and the catering permit shall be not less than ten 22 dollars (\$10.00)nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per twenty-four (24) hour period, payable to the 23 24 appropriate licensing authority.

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2 (f) Notwithstanding W.S. 12-2-301(a), the holder of a 3 limited wine and malt beverage permit issued pursuant to this section may purchase wine or malt beverages for resale 4 5 under the conditions of the permit from any holder of a retail liquor license under this act. 6 7 12-4-504. Special limited wine and malt beverage 8 permit for public auditoriums, civic centers or events 9 centers. 10 11 The appropriate licensing authority in a county, 12 city or town may issue a special limited wine and malt 13 beverage permit to any responsible person or organization 14 for sales of wine and malt beverages at public auditoriums, 15 civic centers or events centers meeting the qualifications 16 of subsection (b) of this section. 17 18 19 (b) To qualify for a special limited wine and malt 20 beverage permit as authorized pursuant to this section the 21 appropriate licensing authority shall require that: 22 (c) No person or organization holding the special 23

limited wine and malt beverage permit shall sell

1 alcoholic liquor other than wine and malt beverages on the

2 premises described on the permit, nor shall any wine or

3 malt beverage be sold for consumption off the premises

4 authorized by the permit. It shall be the duty and

5 obligation of the issuing body and the holder of the permit

6 to see that no sales are made to any person under the age

7 of twenty-one (21) years.

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9 12-4-505. Limited wine and malt beverage permit for

10 state fair.

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Upon application, the 12 (a) appropriate licensing 13 authority shall issue to the director of the department of 14 agriculture a limited wine and malt beverage permit for the sale of wine and malt beverages only on the state 15 fairgrounds during the state fair. W.S. 12-5-201 does not 16 17 apply to this subsection. The issuance of a limited wine and malt beverage permit under this subsection shall not be 18 considered an alcoholic beverage permit issued on the basis 19 20 of population as provided in W.S. 12-4-201. Wine and malt 21 beverages shall only be sold for consumption on the state 22 fairgrounds in areas specifically designated by the

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director of the department of agriculture.

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4 (ii) The location of areas where wine and malt
5 beverages may be consumed on the state fairgrounds;
