AN ACT relating to water and sewer districts; providing that electors and voters include qualified electors and landowners; amending requirements for directors; and providing for an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

Section 1. W.S. 41-10-101 by creating a new subsection (b), 41-10-107(d) and 41-10-112(b) are amended to read:

41-10-101. Definitions.

(b) For purposes of this act and application of the Special District Elections Act of 1994 to this act, the term "electors" or "voters" include qualified electors as defined in W.S. 22-29-104(a)(iv) and landowners as defined in W.S. 22-29-104(a)(ii).

41-10-107. Election in connection with establishment.

(d) At the formation election the voters shall vote for or against the formation of the district, and for five (5) ~~taxpaying~~ electors of the district, who shall constitute the board of directors of the district, if organized, to serve until the next regular subsequent director election.

41-10-112. Subsequent elections of members of board of directors of district.

(b) District board members shall serve for a term of four (4) years, except that at the first regular subsequent director election following the formation of the district there shall be elected by the voters of the district two

(2) members of the board to serve for a term of two (2) years and three (3) members to serve for terms of four (4) years. Thereafter elections shall be held every two (2) years. Each director shall be a ~~taxpaying~~-voter of the district.

Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2013.
