- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 6-3-203(h) and by creating new
- 9 subsections (q) and (r) is amended to read:

- 6-3-203. Cruelty to animals; penalties; limitation on
- 12 manner of destruction.

- 14 (h) If a person convicted of a violation of this
- 15 section is also the owner of the animal, the court may
- 16 require the person to forfeit ownership of the animal to

the county in which the person is convicted. 1 This

2 subsection shall not affect the interest of any secured

party or other person who has not participated in the 3

4 offense. Nothing in this subsection shall be deemed to

5 affect any authority to prevent animal cruelty under

subsection (q) or (r) of this section. 6

(q) Any local government peace officer or animal 8 control officer as authorized by W.S. 15-1-103(a)(xiv) may 9 10 lawfully interfere to prevent the perpetration of any act of cruelty upon any animal, including a household pet, in 11 his presence. Any person who interferes with, obstructs or 12 13 resists any peace officer in the discharge of his duty 14 under this subsection shall be fined not less than two hundred dollars (\$200.00) nor more than one thousand five 15 hundred dollars (\$1,500.00), or imprisoned not more than 16 one (1) year, or both. As used in this subsection "animal" 17 shall not include livestock as defined in W.S. 18 11-20-101(a)(iv). Except in cases of gross or willful 19 negligence, nothing in this subsection shall apply to any 20 21 livestock guarding animal or livestock herding dog which is

actively engaged in protecting or herding livestock.

1 (r) Any local government peace officer or animal control officer as authorized by W.S. 15-1-103(a)(xiv) may 2 3 take charge of any animal including a household pet found 4 abandoned, neglected or cruelly treated as defined in this 5 section. He shall give notice to the owner, if known, and may care and provide for the animal until the animal is 6 released or destroyed. The expenses of care and provision 7 is a charge against the owner of the animal and collectible 8 9 from the owner by the local government employing the peace officer taking charge of the animal in a civil action. The 10 local government may detain the animal until the expense 11 for food, shelter and care is paid and may have a lien upon 12 13 the animal. As used in this subsection "animal" shall not 14 include livestock as defined in W.S. 11-20-101(a)(iv). Except in cases of gross or willful negligence, nothing in 15 this subsection shall apply to any livestock guarding 16 17 animal or livestock herding dog which is actively engaged in protecting or herding livestock. 18
