A BILL

for

1	AN ACT relating to early childhood education and
2	development programs; requiring the director of the
3	department of education to coordinate state early childhood
4	education programs and accordingly granting authority and
5	imposing responsibilities; providing resources to
6	supplement local and private funds for the development and
7	extension of early childhood education programs;
8	establishing a grant program for high quality programs
9	provided by school districts and nonprofit service
10	providers; specifying conditions for resource assistance
11	and grants; imposing reporting requirements; granting
12	rulemaking authority; providing appropriations; and
13	providing for an effective date.

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15 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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Section 1. W.S. 1 21-2-202(a) by creating a new 2 paragraph (xxxv) is amended to read: 3 4 21-2-202. Duties of the director. 5 In addition to any other duties assigned by law, 6 the director shall: 7 8 9 (xxxv) Coordinate early childhood education programs provided by the department of education, the 10 11 department of family services, the department of health and the department of workforce services, including programs 12 13 targeting educationally disadvantaged children, and provide support to local governments, political subdivisions, 14 nonprofit organizations and private entities in developing 15 and expanding early childhood education programs providing 16 17 education and care for children in preparation for successful learning in the public education system. 18 19 20 Section 2. 21 In addition to reporting requirements imposed 22 (a) under sections 3 and 4 of this act, the director shall 23

1 report to the joint education interim committee by not

2 later than December 1, 2015, on the following:

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(i) Development of a long-term state strategic 4 5 plan endorsed by the state board of education and each agency which provides 6 participating state for the development of broad based dissemination and use of early 7 foundations, implementation of professional 8 learning 9 training in these foundations at the local 10 and progress reporting assessment of statewide 11 implementation of early learning foundations

identification of statewide long-term goals and objectives;

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14 (ii) Agreement between the department education, the department of family services, 15 department of health and the department of workforce 16 17 services on the contribution and support of each agency to the development and achievement of the long-term state 18 strategic plan established pursuant to paragraph (i) of 19 20 subsection supporting systems for local program 21 development, improvement and sustenance;

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23 (iii) Through collaboration and consultation 24 with school districts, local early childhood education and

1 care program providers and the statewide education

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16 (a) Except for administrative expenditures authorized

17 under section 5(a) of this act, in addition to section 3 of

18 this act and for the period commencing July 1, 2014, and

19 ending June 30, 2017, one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00)

20 is appropriated from the general fund to the department of

21 education for a grant program available to school districts

22 or other nonprofit service providers for developing,

23 enhancing and sustaining high quality early childhood

24 education programs, including programs targeting

1 educationally disadvantaged children. Program grants shall

2 be available under this section for supplementing not

3 supplanting amounts available locally and otherwise subject

4 to the purposes, expenditure criteria, evaluation,

5 accountability and reporting requirements established by

6 the director pursuant to section 2 of this act in

7 consultation with the department of education, department

8 of family services, department of health, department of

9 workforce services and the Wyoming early childhood state

10 advisory council, including:

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12 (i) Initiation or completion of a community

13 needs assessment and strategic plan for the creation of

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A process for grant administration under this 10 11 section shall be established by rule and regulation of the director, promulgated in sufficient time to enable awarding 12 13 of grants to applicant school districts and nonprofit service providers during school year 2014-2015. Notice of 14 the grant program together with necessary application forms 15 and program information shall be provided to school 16 17 districts and existing nonprofit service providers operating in the state not later than May 1, 2014. 18 Evaluation of applications shall be based upon criteria 19 specified in subsection (a) of this section and no district 20 21 or nonprofit service provider shall be awarded more than 22 one (1) grant under this section. In determining grant amounts consideration shall be given to the following: 23

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1 (i) The number of children estimated to 2 participate or currently participating in the program; 3 4 (ii) The total program costs; 5 (iii) The total amounts available locally 6 to otherwise for the program for which the grant 7 supplement; 8 9 (iv) A maximum award amount of one hundred fifty 10 thousand dollars (\$150,000.00). 11 12 13 Each grant recipient shall report to the director on the expenditure of grant amounts awarded under this 14 section, including the number of children served by the 15 early childhood education program and support services, the 16 17 impact of the award on total program delivery, the ability of the community to address early childhood education needs 18 the grant award and other criteria 19 through use of 20 established under section 2 of this act. 21 Section 5. 22 23

1 (a) Notwithstanding sections 3(a) and 4(a) of this

2 act, up to five percent (5%) of the general fund

3 appropriation for assistance and grants under sections 3

4 and 4 of this act, as authorized under section 2 of this

5 act, may be appropriated on the effective date of this act.

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7 (b) On before December 1, 2014, and each December 1

8 thereafter through December 1, 2017, the director shall

9 report expenditures of amounts appropriated under section 3

10 of this act, together with a compilation of reports

11 collected under section 4(c) of this act, to the joint

12 education and the joint labor, health and social services

13 interim committees. The director shall recommend any

14 modification to the supplemental assistance and grant

15 programs funded under this act, together with any future

16 funding sources.

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18 Section 6. This act is effective immediately upon

19 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

20 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

21 Constitution.
