A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to authority of the federal government; 2 recognizing the constitutional limitations on rulemaking

3 authority of federal agencies and specifically the

4 environmental protection agency; providing legislative

5 findings in relation to those limitations; specifying the

6 policy of the state in regard to actions of the

7 environmental protection agency; authorizing the attorney

8 general to take actions; authorizing and prioritizing the

9 use of federal natural resource policy account funds; and

10 providing for an effective date.

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12 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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14 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-14-102 is created to read:

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9-14-102. Unauthorized federal agency actions.

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2 (a) The legislature finds:

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- 4 (i) Rules enacted and other actions taken by a
- 5 federal agency in excess of authority authorized by the
- 6 United States congress acting within its powers under the
- 7 United States constitution violate the constitution;

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- 9 (ii) The federal environmental protection agency
- 10 has increasingly expanded its rulemaking authority granted
- 11 by the United States congress in creation of the agency in
- 12 1970;

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- 14 (iii) Rulemaking and other actions of the
- 15 federal environmental protection agency have severely
- 16 impacted the ability of the state and its citizens to
- 17 prudently develop the state's natural resources;

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- 19 (iv) When rulemaking and other actions of the
- 20 federal environmental protection agency rest on
- 21 questionable congressional authority the state must act to
- 22 protect its interests and the interests of its citizens and
- 23 should challenge those actions, including unlawful
- 24 rulemaking.

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2 (b) The legislature declares it is the state's policy
3 to vigorously defend its interests and those of its
4 citizens against rulemaking and other actions of the
5 federal environmental protection agency which are not
6 authorized by the United States congress or which rest upon
7 questionable authority.

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9 The attorney general may seek to take action 10 before the federal environmental protection agency or in 11 any state or federal court in Wyoming to stop the enforcement, administration or implementation of rulemaking 12 13 or other actions taken by that agency if, in his judgment, the rulemaking or other action exceeds the authority 14 granted by the United States congress or otherwise rests on 15 questionable authority. The attorney general is directed 16 17 to advance arguments that protect the state's tax base or protect the property rights of its citizens. 18 intervening in or initiating any lawsuit pursuant to this 19 section, the attorney general shall obtain the approval of 20 21 the governor.

2	created; purposes.
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4	(c) In the expenditure of funds from the federal
5	natural resources policy account pursuant to this section,
6	preference shall be given to those funding requests that:
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8	(i) Enhance the ability of a county to
9	participate in federal natural resource policy matters; or
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11	(ii) Fund actions taken under paragraph (a)(iii)
12	of this section as the governor determines necessary or
13	advisable to protect the state's tax base or property
14	rights within the state from actions taken by the
15	environmental protection agency.
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17	Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon
18	completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law
19	as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
20	Constitution.
