7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 9 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-2-301, as amended by 2013 Wyoming
- 10 Session Laws, Chapter 1, is amended to read:

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- 12 21-2-301. Appointment; qualifications, terms and
- 13 removal of members; meetings; chairman.

- 15 (a) There is created a state board of education
- 16 composed of thirteen (13) members, eleven (11) of whom

1 shall be voting appointed members. with at least one (1) 2 member appointed from each appointment district pursuant to W.S. 9-1-218. Appointments from each appointment district 3 4 shall be rotated among the several counties comprising the 5 district Of the voting members, five (5) shall be appointed at large by the governor and six (6) shall be elected by 6 nonpartisan ballot in accordance with subsection (b) of 7 this section. The remaining two (2) members of the board 8 9 shall be the state superintendent of public instruction and the director of the state department of education. 10 11 state superintendent and the director shall be ex-officio members and shall not have the right to vote. 12 13 appointed voting member shall be appointed at large and shall be a certified classroom teacher at the time of 14 appointment, one (1) appointed member shall also be 15 appointed at large and shall be a certified school 16 17 administrator at the time of appointment, . Two (2) appointed members shall be appointed at large one (1) shall 18 19 be a member of a board of trustees of a school district 20 with enrollment greater than the statewide average Wyoming 21 school district, as computed at the time of appointment, one (1) shall be a member of a board of trustees of a 22 school district with enrollment less than the average 23 24 Wyoming school district and one (1) shall be a

representative of private business or industry in Wyoming. 1 On and after March 1, 2013 and upon expiration of their 2 respective terms, the appointments of the two (2) members 3 previously designated to be representative of business or 4 industry shall be at large, one (1) a representative of 5 Wyoming private business or industry and one (1) a member 6 of a school district board of trustees at the time of 7 appointment. The first appointment to the term of such 8 9 member which expires on or after March 1, 2013, shall be a 10 school district board member at the time of appointment. 11 The remaining seven (7) appointed members of the board shall be appointed from among the lay citizens of the state 12 who are electors of the state, known for their public 13 spirit, business or professional ability and interest in 14 education. Not more than six (6) appointed members of the 15 board shall be from one (1) political party. Members shall 16 17 be appointed for six (6) year terms, except those who may be appointed to fill unexpired terms. Appointed members 18 shall be appointed by the governor with the approval of 19 20 confirmed by the senate. Vacancies shall be filled by the 21 governor without senate approval until the next session of 22 the legislature. No member is eligible to reappointment, except any member appointed to fill an unexpired term of 23 24 less than six (6) years may be reappointed for one (1)

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additional six (6) year term. Appointed members of the 1 2 board may be removed by the governor as provided in W.S. 3 9-1-202. 4 5 (b) The remaining six (6) voting members of the state board shall be elected by nonpartisan ballot at each 6 general election for a term of four (4) years pursuant to 7 the provisions of this section and title 22 of the Wyoming 8 9 statutes. One (1) member shall be elected from among the qualified elector residents of each of the following six 10 11 (6) election districts: 12 (i) State board of education district 1 which 13 14 shall consist of senate legislative districts 4, 5, 6, 7 15 and 8; 16 17 (ii) State board of education district 2 which shall consist of senate legislative districts 9, 10, 11, 12 18 19 and 13; 20 21 (iii) State board of education district 3 which 22 shall consist of senate legislative districts 14, 15, 16, 23 25 and 26;

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(iv) State board of education district 4 which 1 shall consist of senate legislative districts 17, 18, 19, 2 3 20 and 21; 4 5 (∇) State board of education district 5 which shall consist of senate legislative districts 22, 27, 28, 6 7 29 and 30; 8 9 (vi) State board of education district 6 which shall consist of senate legislative districts 1, 2, 3, 23 10 11 and 24. 12 13 (b) (c) During the first quarter of the calendar year a meeting shall be held at which a chairman shall be 14 elected. Meetings may be held at regular intervals as 15 often as the duties of the board require and the board 16 17 shall meet at the call of the state superintendent of public instruction, or the director, the governor or the 18 19 chairman whenever in the opinion of these officials, or any 20 of them, the need for such meeting exists. 21 (c) (d) Notwithstanding subsection 22 (a) of this section, the superintendent of public instruction and the 23 director shall not participate in board deliberations on 24

6 5 shall be for a term of two (2) years.

1 bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of

2 the Wyoming Constitution, subject to section 3 of this act

3 as provided by subsection (b) of this section.

5 If a final order by the district court of Laramie County, Wyoming, is issued implementing without change the 6 final ruling of the Wyoming Supreme Court issued January 7 28, 2014, in the case of Kerry and Clara Powers, on behalf 8 9 of themselves and the citizens of Wyoming, and Cindy Hill, on behalf of herself and as the Superintendent of Public 10 11 Instruction v. State of Wyoming and Matthew H. Mead, Governor, in his official capacity [Docket No. S-13-0052], 12 13 then upon expiration of time for appeal of that order, or 14 if appealed, upon issuance of a final order or mandate of the Wyoming Supreme Court confirming the district court 15 final order, the Governor shall certify the entry of the 16 17 district court final order. The Governor shall immediately file any certification under this section together with the 18 final order with the secretary of state. 19 Upon filing certification with the secretary of state, section 3 of 20 21 this act is effective and shall supersede W.S. 21-2-301, as 22 amended by section 1 of this act.
