7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 9 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-2-304(a)(iii)(intro) and (c) and
- 10 21-13-101(a)(v) are amended to read:

12 21-2-304. Duties of the state board of education.

14 (a) The state board of education shall:

15

1 (iii) By rule and regulation, subject to review by the Wyoming legislature as required by subsection (c) of 2 this section, and in consultation and coordination with 3 local school districts, prescribe uniform student content 4 5 and performance standards for the common core of knowledge common core of skills specified under W.S. 6 and the 21-9-101(b), and promulgate uniform standards for programs 7 addressing the special needs of student populations 8 9 specified under W.S. 21-9-101(c) that ensure these student 10 populations are provided the opportunity to learn 11 common core knowledge and skills as prescribed by the uniform student content and performance standards pursuant 12 13 this paragraph. Student content and performance 14 standards prescribed under this paragraph shall include standards for graduation from any high school within any 15 school district of this state and shall describe required 16 17 performance levels in order to achieve proficiency of the common core of knowledge and common core of 18 skills prescribed under W.S. 21-9-101(b). The ability to prescribe 19 content and performance standards shall not be construed to 20 21 the state board of education the authority to prescribe textbooks or curriculum which the state board is 22 hereby forbidden to do. Graduation standards imposed under 23 24 this paragraph shall require the successful completion of

5 The state board shall perform an ongoing review state board duties prescribed by law and may make 6 recommendations to the legislature on board duties. 7 addition and not less than once every five (5) years, the 8 9 board shall evaluate and review the uniformity and quality of the educational program standards imposed under W.S. 10 11 21-9-101 and 21-9-102 and the student content performance standards promulgated under paragraph (a)(iii) 12 section, 13 of this and shall report findings recommendations to the joint education interim committee of 14 the legislature on or before December November 1 of the 15 year in which the review and evaluation was undertaken. The 16 17 recommendations shall include identification of any education program standards that the state board 18 19 anticipates will require revision of the accompanying rules 20 and regulations. The joint education interim committee 21 shall report its recommendations, based upon findings and recommendations of the state board, to the legislature 22 23 during the immediately following legislative 24 Effective April 15, 2014 and each year thereafter, and
