A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to public education; providing for consent
- 2 prior to collection, storage, access or sharing of
- 3 student's educational or personal information; providing
- 4 for retention of consents; providing for penalties; and
- 5 providing for effective dates.

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

9 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-2-205 is created to read:

11 21-2-205. Privacy in education act; penalty.

- 13 (a) Any data that is or may be construed to be
- 14 related to any student's education or to any student's
- 15 personal information that any public entity desires to
- 16 collect, store or access shall not be collected, stored or

1 accessed without the express written consent of the

2 student, or the student's parents or guardians if the

3 student is a minor. The student, or the student's parents

4 or guardians in the case of a minor, shall be explicitly

5 informed as to what specific data will be collected, how it

6 will be collected, the name and contact information of the

7 entity collecting the data and for what purpose the data is

8 being collected.

9

10 Any data that is or may be construed to be 11 related to any student's education or to any student's personal information that is collected, stored or accessed 12 13 by any public entity shall not be shared with any other public or private entity without the express written 14 consent of the student, or the student's parents or 15 quardians if the student is a minor. The student, or the 16 17 student's parents or guardians in the case of a minor, shall be explicitly informed as to what specific data will 18 be shared, the name and contact information of the entity 19 20 with whom the data will be shared, for what purpose the

(c) <u>Subject to W.S. 21-2-205</u>, the department shall establish annual reporting procedures for purposes of policy analysis and program evaluation and providing accurate data to the legislature and governor relative to the program's impact on the state and on students. In developing the annual reporting procedure the department

11 Subject to W.S. 21-2-205, the department shall collect data for the state's school finance system and in 12 13 accordance with rule and regulation of the director, administer the Wyoming education resource block grant model 14 adopted by the Wyoming legislature pursuant to W.S. 15 21-13-309. As used in this section, "school finance system" 16 means all statutes related to the terms and conditions 17 under which funds from Wyoming sources are made available 18 law to the public schools for school 19 under Wyoming 20 operations. The school finance system established following 21 a 1995 Wyoming supreme court decision, and subsequently 22 modified and recalibrated as required under W.S. 21-13-309(t), is extremely complex and requires timely and 23

by subsection 1 except as provided (C) of this 2 section.(c) If a final order by the district court of 3 Laramie County, Wyoming, is issued implementing without 4 change the final ruling of the Wyoming Supreme Court issued 5 January 28, 2014, in the case of Kerry and Clara Powers, on behalf of themselves and the citizens of Wyoming, and Cindy 6 7 Hill, on behalf of herself and as the Superintendent of Public Instruction v. State of Wyoming and Matthew H. Mead, 8 9 Governor, in his official capacity [Docket No. S-13-0052], 10 then upon expiration of time for appeal of that order, or 11 if appealed, upon issuance of a final order or mandate of the Wyoming Supreme Court confirming the district court 12 13 final order, the Governor shall certify the entry of the district court final order. The Governor shall immediately 14 file any certification under this section together with the 15 final order with the secretary of state. 16 Ιf the 17 certification is filed with the secretary of state after July 1, 2014, section 4 of this act is effective upon 18 filing and shall supersede section 3 of this act. If the 19 20 certification is filed with the secretary of state before 21 July 1, 2014, section 4 of this act is effective July 1, 22 2014 and shall supersede section 3 of this act.
