AN ACT relating to public education; providing for a 1 2 process to address a 2014 Supreme Court decision relating to the structure and oversight of the state's public school 3 system; requiring a legislative study; providing for the 4 delegation of powers and duties relating 5 to the administration of the state's school system; providing an 6 appropriation; and providing for an effective date. 7 8 9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

The legislature finds: 13 (a)

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15 (i) In its ruling issued January 28, 2014, in the case of Kerry and Clara Powers, on behalf of themselves 16 and the citizens of Wyoming, and Cindy Hill, on behalf of 17

- 1 herself and as the Superintendent of Public Instruction v.
- 2 State of Wyoming and Matthew H. Mead, Governor, in his
- 3 official capacity [Docket No. S-13-0052], the Supreme Court
- 4 responded to a certified question finding 2013 Wyoming
- 5 Session Laws, Chapter 1, violated Wyoming Constitution,
- 6 Article 7, Section 14;

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- 8 (ii) In its ruling cited under paragraph (i) of
- 9 this subsection, the Supreme Court did not identify which
- 10 powers and duties assigned under 2013 Wyoming Session Laws,
- 11 Chapter 1, were improperly assigned from the state
- 12 superintendent of public instruction, nor did the Supreme
- 13 Court identify those assigned duties which could properly
- 14 be assigned from the state superintendent;

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- 16 (iii) In its ruling cited under paragraph (i) of
- 17 this subsection, the Supreme Court states it was not
- 18 holding that the legislature may not delegate duties and
- 19 powers relating to public education to entities other than
- 20 the state superintendent;

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- 22 (iv) The legislature is tasked with addressing
- 23 those aspects of 2013 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 1,
- 24 which are unconstitutional, and intends to determine the

1 proper assignment of powers and duties meeting

2 constitutional requirements;

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4 (v) The legislature is required to clarify a

5 process for the technical implementation of subsequent

6 legislative actions dependent upon a structure for those

7 state statutes impacted by the ruling cited under paragraph

8 (i) of this subsection;

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10 (vi) The legislature is required to develop a

11 process to disentangle budgeted amounts attached with the

12 several programs and services structured around an

13 assignment of powers and duties under 2013 Wyoming Session

14 Laws, Chapter 1, to a structure reflecting an assignment of

15 powers and duties responding to the ruling cited under

16 paragraph (i) of this subsection;

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18 (vii) The legislature is required to determine

19 the reassignment of powers and duties under 2013 Wyoming

20 Session Laws, Chapter 1, necessary to meet the requirements

21 of the Wyoming Constitution, and to provide the most

22 efficient system for delivering a quality education to

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23 Wyoming's children;

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1 (viii) The legislature is committed to receiving

2 input from educators as well as public testimony prior to

3 developing a response to the Supreme Court ruling.

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5 (b) Based upon the findings specified under subsection (a) of this section and in as close conformity 6 as reasonably possible with all constitutional limitations 7 identified by the supreme court in relation to the opinion 8 9 cited at paragraph (a)(i) of this section, the management council, together with the cochairmen of 10 the appropriations interim committee and the joint education 11 interim committee, shall undertake a study of the powers 12 13 and duties assigned under 2013 Wyoming Session Laws, 14 Chapter 1, and develop recommendations on the reassignment powers and duties necessary to implement public 15 education in Wyoming in accordance with the provisions of 16 17 paragraph (a) (vii) of this section. Recommendations shall address current statutory accountability and assessment 18 responsibilities. The council and the committee cochairmen 19 may delegate hearing and examination of certain topics to 20 21 (1) or more joint interim committees of 22 legislature, to report back to the council for preparation recommendations. 23 of the Recommendations, 24 proposed budgets for related programs and services and

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1 including enabling legislation, shall be developed in

2 sufficient time for submission to members of the

3 legislature on or before ninety (90) days after a final

4 order has been issued by the district court in the case

5 referenced in paragraph (a)(i) of this section and the time

6 for appeal of that order has expired, or if appealed, a

7 final order or mandate of the Wyoming Supreme Court has

8 been issued confirming the district court's final order.

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If the management council and the cochairmen of 10 11 the joint appropriations interim committee and the joint education interim committee, upon conclusion of the study 12 required under subsection (b) of this section, find it 13 appropriate to convene a special session of the legislature 14 to consider legislation implementing study recommendations 15 under subsection (b) of this section, the council together 16 with the committee cochairmen shall recommend a date for 17 convening the special session to the president of the 18 19 senate and the speaker of the house of representatives.

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21 (d) There is appropriated fifty thousand dollars 22 (\$50,000.00) from the general fund to the legislative 23 service office for payment of salary, per diem and mileage 24 for members engaged in the study required by this section.

The report shall include the quality of education including any proposed improvement to address any shortfalls, the relevance of education, the measurement of achievement of educational goals, the improvement of learning and any suggested
